Agreement for Cost-Share Reimbursement Burleigh County Water Resource District McDowell Dam Supplemental Water Supply

- 1. PARTIES. This agreement is between the State of North Dakota (State), by and through the State Water Commission (Commission), and the Burleigh County Water Resource District (Sponsor).
- **2. COMMISSION'S RESPONSIBILITY AND INTENT.** Commission will provide Sponsor with cost-share, not to exceed \$45,177, as approved by Secretary, to reimburse 40 percent of the actual eligible costs incurred in Sponsor's McDowell Dam Supplemental Water Supply (Project), contingent on availability of funds and conditions of this agreement. Commission's intent in providing this funding to Sponsor is merely to help Sponsor financially afford Project. Sponsor retains sole and absolute discretion in the manner and means of carrying out Project, except to the extent specified in this agreement.

3. Sponsor's Responsibilities. Sponsor must:

- a. Complete Project.
- b. Provide continued maintenance for Project.
- c. Ensure all applicable permits (federal, state, and local) are obtained.
- d. Acquire all title to land and easements for Project.
- e. Comply with all North Dakota laws governing the requirements for competitive bids, advertising, and awarding of contracts for construction of Project.
- f. Maintain a Project file containing relevant documents and correspondence generated during the course of Project. State is not responsible for maintaining a Project file.
- g. Provide a progress report to Commission at least every four years if the term of Project exceeds four years. If a progress report is not timely received, or if after a review of a progress report Commission determines Project has not made sufficient progress, Commission may terminate the agreement for Project funding.
- h. Prior to signature, inform Commission and any other relevant party regarding Project of any errors, misinterpretations, changes, modifications, miscalculations, incorrect Project descriptions, or any other information stated herein that is inaccurate.
- **4. PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION**. Project is preliminary engineering for a project to pump water from Apple Creek to McDowell Dam to maintain the service level of the dam for recreation purposes. Project is located in Burleigh County, North Dakota.

- **5. ELIGIBLE COSTS.** Commission has sole discretion to determine eligible costs and availability of Commission funds. Additional information is outlined in Commission's cost-share policy.
- **6. PAYMENT.** Commission will make partial payments upon receipt and approval of Sponsor's written request. Sponsor must provide Commission verification of actual costs and a Project status report with each payment request. A Commission representative may inspect Project to determine whether the work satisfies Commission's cost share requirements before Commission makes payment(s) to Sponsor. Request for final payment must include a copy of Project.
- 7. INDEMNIFICATION. Sponsor must require all subcontractors, other than state employed subcontractors, before commencement of an agreement between Sponsor and the subcontractor, to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless State, from and against claims based on the vicarious liability of State or its agents, but not against claims based on State's negligence or intentional misconduct. This obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless does not extend to professional liability claims arising from professional errors and omissions. The legal defense provided by subcontractor to State under this provision must be free of any conflicts of interest, even if retention of separate legal counsel for State is necessary. Subcontractor also agrees to reimburse State for all costs, expenses, and attorneys' fees incurred if State prevails in an action against subcontractor in establishing and litigating the indemnification coverage required herein. This obligation continues after the termination of this agreement.
- **8. INSURANCE.** State and Sponsor each must secure and keep in force during the term of this agreement, from an insurance company, government self-insurance pool, or government self-retention fund authorized to do business in North Dakota, commercial general liability with minimum limits of liability of \$250,000 per person and \$500,000 per occurrence.

In addition, Sponsor must require all subcontractors, other than state employed subcontractors, before commencement of an agreement between Sponsor and the subcontractor, to secure and keep in force during the term of this agreement, from insurance companies authorized to do business in North Dakota, the following insurance coverages:

- a. Commercial general liability, including premises or operations, contractual, and products or completed operations coverages (if applicable), with minimum liability limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- b. Automobile liability, including Owned (if any), Hired, and Non-owned automobiles, with minimum liability limits of \$250,000 per person and \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- c. Workers compensation coverage meeting all statutory requirements. The policy must provide coverage for all states of operation that apply to the performance of this contract.
- d. If subcontractor is domiciled outside State, employer's liability or "stop gap" insurance of not less than \$1,000,000 as an endorsement on the workers compensation or commercial general liability insurance.

The insurance coverages listed above must meet the following additional requirements:

- e. Any deductible or other similar obligation under the policies is the sole responsibility of the subcontractor. The amount of any deductible is subject to approval by State.
- f. This insurance may be in policy or policies of insurance, primary and excess, including the so-called umbrella or catastrophe form, and must be placed with insurers rated "A-" or better by A.M. Best Company, Inc., provided any excess policy follows form for coverage. Less than an "A-" rating must be approved by State. The policies must be in form and terms approved by State.
- g. State will be defended, indemnified, and held harmless to the full extent of any coverage actually secured by the subcontractor in excess of the minimum requirements set forth above. The duty to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless State under this agreement is not limited by the insurance required in this agreement.
- h. State must be endorsed on the commercial general liability policy, including any excess policies, as additional insured. State must have all the benefits, rights, and coverages of an additional insured under these policies that are not limited to the minimum limits of insurance required by this agreement or by the contractual indemnity obligations of Sponsor.
- i. The insurance required in this agreement, through a policy or endorsement, must include:
 - (1) A "Waiver of Subrogation" waiving any right to recovery the insurance company may have against State;
 - (2) A provision that subcontractor's insurance coverage is primary (i.e., pay first) as respects any insurance, self-insurance, or self-retention maintained by State and that any insurance, self- insurance, or self-retention maintained by State must be in excess of the subcontractor's insurance and must not contribute with it;
 - (3) Cross liability/severability of interest for all policies and endorsements;
 - (4) The legal defense provided to State under the policy and any endorsements must be free of any conflicts of interest, even if retention of separate legal counsel for State is necessary;
 - (5) The insolvency or bankruptcy of the insured subcontractor must not release the insurer from payment under the policy, even when such insolvency or bankruptcy prevents the insured subcontractor from meeting the retention limit under the policy.
- j. Failure to provide insurance as required in this agreement is a material breach of contract entitling State to terminate this agreement immediately.
- **9. BREACH.** Violation of any provision of this agreement by Sponsor constitutes breach of this agreement. A breach obligates Sponsor to reimburse Commission for all funds paid to Sponsor and relieves Commission of all obligations under this agreement.
- **10. AGREEMENT BECOMES VOID.** This agreement is void if not signed and returned by Sponsor within 60 days of Commission's signature.

11. TERMINATION.

- a. Commission may terminate this agreement effective upon delivery of written notice to Sponsor, or a later date as may be stated in the notice, under any of the following conditions:
 - (1) If Commission determines an emergency exists.
 - (2) If funding from federal, state, or other sources is not obtained and continued at levels sufficient to provide the funds necessary to comply with this agreement. The parties may modify this agreement to accommodate a reduction in funds.
 - (3) If federal or state laws or rules are modified or interpreted in a way that the services are no longer allowable or appropriate for purchase under this agreement or are no longer eligible for the funding proposed for payments authorized by this agreement.
 - (4) If any license, permit, or certificate required by law, rule, or this agreement is denied, revoked, suspended, or not renewed.
 - (5) If Commission determines that continuing the agreement is no longer necessary or would not produce beneficial results commensurate with the further expenditure of public funds.
- b. Any termination of this agreement is without prejudice to any obligations or liabilities of either party already accrued prior to termination.
- c. The rights and remedies of any party provided in this agreement are not exclusive.
- 12. APPLICABLE LAW AND VENUE. This agreement is governed by and construed under the laws of State. Any action to enforce this agreement must be adjudicated exclusively in the District Court of Burleigh County, North Dakota.
- 13. **SEVERABILITY.** If any term of this agreement is declared by a court having jurisdiction to be illegal or unenforceable, the validity of the remaining terms is unaffected, and if possible, the rights and obligations of the parties are to be construed and enforced as if the agreement did not contain that term.
- 14. SPOLIATION PRESERVATION OF EVIDENCE. Sponsor agrees to promptly notify Commission of all potential claims that arise or result from this agreement. Sponsor must also take all reasonable steps to preserve all physical evidence and information that may be relevant to the circumstances surrounding a potential claim, while maintaining public safety, and grants to Commission the opportunity to review and inspect the evidence, including the scene of an accident.
- **15. MERGER AND MODIFICATION.** This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. There are no understandings, agreements, or representations, oral or written, not specified within this agreement. This agreement may not be modified, supplemented, or amended in any manner, except by written agreement signed by both parties.

I appreciate you contacting NRCS to consult on the proposed structural modifications to the principal spillway riser on McDowell Dam. As you know, NRCS completed the design and provided partial funding for construction of this dam. The resulting Operation and Maintenance Agreement, requiring Burleigh WRD to obtain NRCS approval prior to structural modifications being made to the dam, remains active through 2026. The dam has a principal outlet works with a weir crest at an elevation 1724.0 feet (NAVD 29). The proposed modification to the structure, as listed in your letter of 11/30/21, would permanently raise the weir crest 1-foot to an elevation of 1725.0 feet (NAVD 29).

McDowell Dam was originally designed as a Low Hazard class structure however, as indicated in the 2015 Dam Assessment Report completed by HDR Engineering under contract with NRCS, is at least a Significant Hazard structure currently. Despite the cursory estimate of 9 lives at risk listed by HDR, the scope of the dam assessment was not adequate in detail to evaluate depth and velocity combinations at homes or over roadways, to definitively determine if it would meet NRCS High Hazard criteria (i.e. a single life at risk). ND DWR imposes a higher threshold in terms of lives at risk, so it is possible that the dam is a High Hazard by NRCS criteria and a significant Hazard by ND DWR criteria. In order to be consistent with the previous dam assessment, we evaluated the proposed modification under Significant Hazard criteria. In addition, we did not replace the original hydraulics inputs with the 2021 ND PMP update nor was the analysis updated to incorporate currently available LiDAR topographic data in place of the USGS 30-meter DEM elevation data utilized in the 2015 assessment.

NRCS requirements for earthen dams are outlined in Technical Release 210-60, Earth Dams and Reservoirs, and are incorporated into the SITES computer model. Results from the 2015 HDR SITES model, representing existing condition, and modified output to represent the proposed condition, are summarized below and included in the detailed results attached.

Principal Spillway Hydrograph (PSH)

- As currently designed with a weir elevation of 1724.0 ft, the auxiliary spillway is activated during the PSH. By raising the weir to an elevation of 1725.0 ft, the auxiliary spillway is still activated by the PSH.
- The routing of the PSH does occur within the ten days for both the existing weir design and the proposed 1-foot raise. The drawdown occurs faster with the higher crest elevation as there is ultimately less water to draw down.

Auxiliary Spillway Hydrograph (SDH) and Freeboard Hydrograph (FBH)

To analyze the effects that raising the principal spillway weir would have on the SDH and FBH, the model was computed for weir inverts at 1724 ft and 1725 ft. Both the 6-and 24-Hr storms were analyzed and the starting reservoir water surface elevations (WSE's) were set at the top of weir. The maximum WSE's for the existing versus proposed conditions are displayed in the following table.

As noted in the 2015 Dam Assessment, McDowell Dam does not meet current dam safety requirements. The figures listed above make clear the fact both the SDH and FBH events overtop the dam (1733.8 ft NAVD29). Raising the pool elevation by the proposed 1-foot results in a less than 0.1- foot rise in water surface elevation during those events, which is likely within the errors of the model. For that reason, NRCS does not object to the proposed modification.

I do want to strongly encourage you to consider pursuing a NRCS Watershed Rehabilitation Project for McDowell Dam, to address the identified dam safety deficiencies. The program is currently available only for high hazard dams, however if the Burleigh WRD were to express an interest, NRCS would be willing to complete a hazard assessment under our criteria using currently available topographic data and the most recent PMP. There would be no cost to the Burleigh WRD for this effort. If the dam were indeed determined to be high hazard by NRCS guidance, we could proceed with rehabilitation planning to evaluate alternatives for upgrades to the structure. NRCS would potentially fund 90-100% of the watershed rehabilitation planning effort, 100% of final design, and 65% of eventual construction dependent on available funding. The rehabilitation planning effort could incorporate modifications to the principal spillway, as needed.

INTRODUCTION

Recently questions were raised regarding the various jurisdictional or regulatory authorities that exist regarding bank stabilization projects along the Missouri River in Burleigh County. This memorandum is intended to document known jurisdiction; however it is not intended to be all inclusive. It is important to understand most regulatory authorities are independent of each other, however some are interconnected through the permit application review and approval process. There are several primary agencies and political subdivisions with regulatory authority, including the following:

North Dakota State Engineer – Sovereign Lands

US Army Corps of Engineers – Navigable Waters (Section 404, Section 10 and Section 408)

North Dakota Department of Health – Water Quality (Section 401)

Burleigh County Water Resource District - Section 32 Bank Stabilization Easements

Burleigh County Commission – Garrison/Oahe Bank Stabilization Easements

Zoning Ordinances

Burleigh County Floodplain Administrator – National Flood Insurance Program

North Dakota State Historical Society – Archeological (Section 106)

JURISDICTIONAL AUTHORITIES

This memorandum considers the general process associated with a proposed project to construct a bank stabilization measures on the Missouri River or structures located within the floodplain in Burleigh County. Most of these authorities also apply to other rivers and streams, however for the purposes of this memorandum the focus is on the Missouri River.

North Dakota State Engineer – Sovereign Lands

The State of North Dakota owns the bed of the Missouri River below the Ordinary High Water Mark (OHWM), as defined in the North Dakota Century Code (NDCC) and pursuant to the North Dakota State Engineer's (NDSE) OHWM Determination Guidelines. *Exhibit A* is the current permit application utilized for projects affecting Sovereign Lands. The NDSE previously has determined the OHWM for many areas along the Missouri River in Burleigh County, though not all. While the OHWM is subject to revision and changes with time the line work for its approximate location is available from the NDSE.

US Army Corps of Engineers – Navigable Waters (Waters of the US – Section 404, Section 10 and Section 408)

The US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) has jurisdictional authority for Navigable Waters, typically referred to as "Waters of the US" under various congressional authorities. Section 404 is related to the deposition of materials into Waters of the US, which includes areas below the OHWM. Neither the NDSE or USACE have authority related to structural setbacks from the river bank or their OHWM. See the authorities of Burleigh County (BC) and Burleigh County Water Resource District (BCWRD) for more information on these requirements. Section 10 may apply in some instances (e.g. bridge installations/coast guard, boat traffic, commerce, etc.), however this authority is directed toward navigability. The USACE permit application is attached as *Exhibit B*.

In addition, the USACE has authorities under Section 408, which are associated with modifications to an existing federally constructed structure. There are two previous bank stabilization efforts that were complete by the USACE on the Missouri River. These are discussed later as part of the BCWRD and BC easements.

While the terminology may be different the USACE's OHWM determinations could vary from that defined by the NDSE, they are generally deemed as being equivalent.

North Dakota Department of Health – Section 401

The North Dakota Department of Health (NDHD) has jurisdictional authority over water quality impacts from such projects. These are addressed through the Section 401 process and their consultation process with the USACE through Section 404 and Section 10. These authorities are governed under the primacy of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and passed back to the NDDH for implementation. Generally, the NDHD responds to permit applications and their standard conditions are included as part of the USACE Section 404, Section 10 and NDSE Sovereign Land permit approvals. The NDDH does not issue individual permits and could prevent certain projects from occurring, if they were to determine adverse water quality impacts would occur.

Burleigh County Water Resource District – Section 32 Bank Stabilization Easements

The BCWRD holds easements along those reaches of the Missouri River containing federal projects constructed under the Section 32 Revetment program. The BCWRD shares equally (50%/50%) in the operation and maintenance obligations with the North Dakota State Water Commission (SWC) for these facilities, see *Exhibit C*. These federal projects were constructed by the USACE under Public Law 93-251, Section 32 Streambank Erosion Control Evaluation and Demonstration Act of 1974, which was subsequently amended under Public Law 94-587.

Modifications to these federally constructed revetments or structures placed within these easements are locally under BCWRD's jurisdiction. In addition, any modifications to the federal structures themselves, is under the jurisdiction of the USACE, Section 408 and requires their approval. The BCWRD is the project sponsor in these easements and is the contact entity for any Section 408 action and communications with the USACE.

While BC has ordinances governing structural setbacks on the river the BCWRD easements govern this restriction in areas where they exist. As an example, on Hogue Island the BCWRD agreed to reduce their easement limits to 100 feet from the top of the river bank. As the top of the river bank can move with erosion some structures are currently located within the designated easement limits. In other areas, these easements were either ignored or miss-located and structures constructed directly within the easement boundaries. The BCWRD jurisdictional authority remains unchanged in these areas, with enforcement relying on notice to the BCWRD by the BC Building Official.

Burleigh County Commission – Garrison/Oahe Bank Stabilization Easements

There are other easements that were obtained by the Burleigh County Commission (BCC) for federal bank stabilization projects. These revetment facilities were constructed by the USACE under Public Law 88-253 (circa 1963) and 90-483 (circa 1968). The BCC provided these easements to the North Dakota State Water Commission (NDSWC) for access to construct the bank stabilization features funded under this program. In turn the BCC signed an agreement with the BCC accepting full (100%) responsibility to operate and maintain these structures after a period of three years following their completion, see *Exhibit D*.

On a related matter the Burleigh County Zoning Ordinance established the OHWM as the elevation based on a flow of 33,000 cfs on the Missouri River. There are also setback requirements from the OHWM which apply to the construction of structures along the bank line. These are addressed in ARTICLE 21, Section 7 of the Burleigh County Ordinances as noted below.

ARTICLE 21 FP FLOODPLAIN DISTRICT REGULATIONS

Section 7. Additional Development Standards for Land Abutting the Missouri River (Non-agricultural uses)

In order to preserve and enhance the environmental and recreational qualities of the Missouri River, conserve the scenic and historic values of the Missouri River shoreland, protect shoreland development from river bank erosion, and provide for the wise use of the river and related land resources, the following additional development standard for non-agricultural uses is hereby established for land abutting the Missouri River:

1. Structure Setbacks.

All structures on lots or parcels with unstablized banks shall be set back a minimum of one hundred (100) feet from the ordinary high water mark of the Missouri River. All structures on lots or parcels with stabilized banks, either by an existing Corps of Engineers' stabilized structure or as permitted and approved by the Corps of Engineers, shall be set back a minimum of seventy-five (75) feet from the ordinary high water mark of the Missouri River.

Burleigh County Planning Commission – Floodplain Administrator

Burleigh County is enrolled in the National Floodplain Insurance Program (NFIP), which is governed under the authority of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). As such Burleigh County has created and implement floodplain ordinances (regulations), that must comply with the minimum standards established by FEMA. Burleigh County therefore is obligated under the NFIP to enforce these ordinances. This includes the issuance of floodplain development permits for any work completed within the Missouri River regulatory floodplain and/or floodway.

This jurisdictional responsibility is entirely separate from the other authorities noted above, including the USACE and their OHWM. The OHWM has no bearing on the jurisdiction and implementation of the floodplain ordinances, however it is used via a reference to a given river flow related to structural setbacks. Subsequently, the Floodplain Administrator is required to issue a floodplain development permit for any change or modifications within the Missouri River floodplain and/or floodway.

The NFIP is critical to obtaining flood insurance within Burleigh County and the City of Bismarck. If Burleigh County or the City does not comply with these regulations and their individually adopted ordinances they risk FEMA suspending their participation in the program and subsequently, flood insurance would no longer be available to Burleigh County or City residents. The following are some notable definition and references from the BC ordinance (circa February 2017). As the City regulates their own program their ordinances are not presented here.

ARTICLE 21 FP FLOODPLAIN DISTRICT REGULATIONS

Section 3. Definitions.

Ordinary High Water Mark - The elevation of the Missouri River at a flow rate of 33,000 cubic feet per second. In areas where there are multiple channels, the ordinary high water mark is the landward extent of the floodway, as delineated on the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Flood Boundary and Floodway Map for Burleigh County.

Stabilized Bank - A river bank that has been stabilized by the Corps of Engineers or under a Corps of Engineers' permit for bank stabilization. If the plans and specifications for the permitted structure were not approved by the Corps of Engineers, or <u>if the structure was not built in accordance with the Corps approved plans and specifications, certification from a registered professional engineer will be required.</u> {underline added}

Note: The reference to "certification from a professional engineer" raises questions since we are not aware of BC ever requiring this, which they must as the language stats "will be required". Neither the USACE or the NDSE require such certification in their permits, therefore, approval of their permits would not satisfy this requirement.

Section 5. Administration.

b. Establishment of a non-structural development permit. A non-structural development permit shall be obtained before any land disturbing activity begins within any special flood hazard area established in subsection 4(b) of this article (basis for establishing the special flood hazard areas). An application for a non-structural development permit shall be made on forms furnished by the Floodplain Administrator and may include, but not be limited to: plans in duplicate drawn to scale showing the nature, location, dimensions, and elevations of the area in question; proposed elevations upon completion of the land disturbing activity; the type of fill being used, if fill is proposed; and a description of the extent to which any watercourse will be altered or relocated as a result of proposed land disturbing activity.

Copies of the Burleigh County Floodplain Development permit applications are not available on line and need to be obtained directly from the Burleigh County Floodplain Administrator.

The City of Bismarck is enrolled as a separate jurisdiction under the NFIP. They also have similar floodplain ordinances and have fixed 100 foot structural setback from the river. Their ordinances are not stated here but are available on their web site.

North Dakota State Historical Society – Archeological (Section 106)

The North Dakota State Historical Society, typically referred to as the State Historical Preservation Office (SHIPO) is involved in comments on both the USACE and NDSE permitting process. This is related to areas that they believe are clear or may contain elements of historical or archeological significance. This is a required under the USACE process and Section 106 consultations.

CONCLUSIONS

In summary, there are multiple jurisdictional authorities in play as it relates to permit applications, regulatory review and approvals for Missouri River bank stabilization or construction along the river. Anyone interested in implementing such projects is encouraged to contact the various agencies and political subdivisions noted above to obtain guidance and direction on how to apply for and to obtain the necessary approvals.

On a related note the BCWRD typically has elected not to comment on permit applications associated with the installation of boat ramps or minor activities along the river. These are reviewed on a case by case basis and comments provided as deemed applicable.

Work Plan and Proposal Missouri River Joint Water Board Education, Advocacy, and Engagement with the Operations and Management of the Missouri River System in North Dakota (Draft 10)

Part 1. Intent and Purpose.

This Work Plan and Proposal (hereafter "Plan") is prepared with an intent to provide a program and process for promoting and encouraging the education, advocacy, and engagement of water policy entities, water managers and the general public of the State of North Dakota (hereafter "Stakeholders") and with the entities and agencies of the State having operational, regulatory, or usage involvement (hereafter '"State") with issues involving the management and operations of the Missouri River System (inclusive of the free flowing main stem river sections and the main stem reservoirs), within the State, and with the federal involvement (past, present, and future) of those activities along with all associated beneficial uses.

It is intended that the objectives and goals of this Plan shall be in accordance with the water policy of the State as established by the North Dakota Department of Water Resources or the ND Legislature.

It is intended that this Plan be the basis for a contract with a Program Manager hired by the Missouri River Joint Water Board (Joint Board or MRJWB).

Part 2. Parties.

The management of this Plan will be by the Missouri River Joint Water Board, which is a legal public entity in the State, and which has representation from the counties of the State which immediately border the Missouri River or a System Reservoir within the State. Participating entities will be the North Dakota Department of Water Resources (hereafter "NDDWR"), acting through the North Dakota State Water Commission (hereafter "SWC"), and may include the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District (hereafter "GDCD"), and other yet undefined entities.

The Owners Representative for this Plan will be Wade Bachmeier, MRJWB Chairman, or his designee.

The Owners Representative shall have the sole responsibility to issue work directives, represent the work to third party and governmental entities, and direct the work of the Program Manager. The Owner's Representative shall determine the level of oversight or other involvement which may be needed by the MRJWB, or by other third parties.

The Plan may contract separately with an Program Manager for pursuit of various or all portions of the Plan. Any such contract with a Program Manager shall require that the work of this Plan be pursued. Any such contract with a Program Manager shall include goals and objectives which align with this Plan.

The Owner's Representative may engage or contract with an interim consultant until a process for a longer-term Program Manager can be achieved.

As may be included in any Program Manager agreement, some duties held by the Owner's Representative may be assigned under specified conditions to the Program Manager.

The MRJWB may enter into a separate contract for services relative to this Plan with the ND Water Users Association (NDWU) and the North Dakota Water Education Foundation (NDWEF). The services envisioned to be provided by the NDWU will primarily be secretarial and administration; no services relative to the strategy of Plan development is envisioned. The services envisioned to be provided by the NDWEF will primarily be for costs of articles or editorials to be featured in the ND Water Magazine. If any such contract is arranged, the agreements between the Program Manager and the NDWU and NDWEF will provide the working relationship between such parties however any such agreement(s) are subject to approval of the Owner's Representative.

Part 3. Scope of Work.

This Plan proposes the following work items:

- A. Educational Component. The Plan will allow for the creation of one or more specifically focused presentations and/or white papers and/or public releases relative to the following issues:
 - a. The development and implementation of the Pick Sloan Act (aka 1944 Flood Control Act and any amendments) within the State of North Dakota.
 - b. The impact the Pick Sloan Act, particularly the reservoirs of the system, has had on the tribal lands and tribal interests within the State.
 - c. An analysis of benefits derived, and yet to be derived, from the Pick Sloan Act facilities within the State.

- d. Ongoing review and position statements relative to ongoing federal agency management and operations of the Missouri River system within the State.
- e. As may be specifically directed by the MRJWB, this Plan will allow selected interaction and sharing of information with third party entities of adjacent States, or with regional or national associations or groups, if in the judgement of the MRJWB, such sharing may provide a benefit to the State of North Dakota.
- f. It is specifically intended that work product of this Plan be shared by presentation or submittal to water management groups and related public and civic groups within the State
- g. It is specifically intended that the ND MRAC strategy sheets, relative to various River issues, be used in this effort.
- h. It is specifically intended that the work products of this Plan be shared with Project W.E.T. for possible sharing with their participants.
- i. It is specifically intended that the resources available by the North Dakota Water Users and the North Dakota Water Education Board, specifically the use of the North Dakota Water Magazine, be utilized in a coordinated effort to achieve the goals of this Plan.
- B. Advocacy Component. The Plan will allow the MRJWB review and provide a more informed input relative to the federal management and operation of the Missouri River System within North Dakota. The following actions are envisioned:
 - a. Creating an ability for the MRJWB to receive and review and offer comments to federal agencies relative to ongoing or proposed criteria in the management and operation of the Missouri River System within North Dakota.
 - b. Creation of a process by which the MRJWB can identify and notify other entities within and outside the State, of management or operational changes proposed or being implemented with the Missouri River System.
 - c. Solicitation from third parties for support or opposition for selected policies and management practices of the federal government in their management and operation of the facilities of the Missouri River System.
 - d. Attendance, and, as appropriate, providing of testimony or comment, at federal Missouri River System management or policy related meetings.
 - e. Special attention shall be afforded to the irrigation needs and potential within the State from the Missouri River System, through coordination with the North Dakota Irrigation Association to identify needs and advocate for increased irrigation support and federal dollars for such needs within the State.

- f. Special attention shall be afforded the municipal, rural, and industrial (MRI) needs and potential within the State from the Missouri River System, through coordination with the North Dakota Rural Water Systems Association and the North Dakota League of Cities to identify needs and advocate for increased federal dollars for such needs within the State.
- g. Special attention shall be afforded the recreational needs and potential within the State from the Missouri River System, through coordination with the Voices of Lake Oahe and the Friends of Lake Sakakawea to identify needs and advocate for increased federal dollars for such needs within the State.
- h. Special attention shall be afforded the industrial needs and potential within the State from the Missouri River System, through coordination with the State Industrial Commission and other appropriate entities to identify needs and advocate
- i. Special attention shall be afforded the tribal water development needs and potential within the State from the Missouri River System, through coordination with the leadership of the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe and the Fort Berthold tribal government to identify needs and advocate for increased federal dollars for such needs within the State.
- C. Engagement Component. This Plan will allow and direct the MRJWB to create and implement a program of active engagement with interested and affected entities of the Missouri River System within the State of North Dakota, as follows:
 - Such entities shall include relevant State and Federal agencies as directed by the MRJWB. Such entities may include, but not be limited to:
 - i. North Dakota Department of Water Resources
 - ii. North Dakota Department of Commerce
 - iii. Legislative Water Topics Committee
 - iv. Congressional delegations
 - v. Individual Legislators or Policy Makers
 - vi. Various ND Water Organizations
 - vii. Various and selected State agencies
 - viii. Federal Regulatory Entities
 - ix. Selected Counties and Cities and other Public Bodies
 - Such entities shall include the member counties and may include other designated interested or affected counties and other public bodies within the State of North Dakota.
 - c. Such entities shall include State legislative offices and Federal Congressional offices.
 - d. This Plan anticipates possible or occasional direct interaction and meetings with all such identified entities.

- e. As may be specifically directed by the MRJWB, this Plan will provide opportunities for selected interaction and sharing of information with third party entities of adjacent States, or with regional or national associations or groups, if in the judgement of the MRJWB, such sharing may provide a benefit to the State of North Dakota.
- f. This Plan will endeavor to create closer and more frequent interaction with the elected policy makers of the State and with the staff of the NDDWR for review of federal Missouri River System management issues and in pursuit of State approved actions relative to that management.
- Part 4. Plan Management. This Plan will be managed by the MRJWB as noted herein, but shall contain the following conditions:
 - A. Any conditions requested or required by any participating funding entities shall be accommodated; if accommodation cannot be made the Owner's Representative shall resolve such conflict.
 - B. The day-to-day administration of the Plan is by the Owner's Representative; that person shall have responsibility for informing the MRJWB of the progress and work of the Plan.
 - C. The Plan shall have an Advisory Committee. The Advisory Committee shall provide input from their selected perspectives on the work and progress of the Plan; the Owner's Representative has full discretion on how such of this input will be utilized in the Plan.
 - D. The Owner's Representative is the designated spokesperson for the Advisory Committee, but no Member is prohibited from making public comments on his own behalf.
 - E. The Advisory Committee shall be formulated by the Owner's Authorized Representative, but is envisioned to be comprised of the following:
 - i. The Owner's Representative, or designee, shall act as the Chair.
 - ii. The Secretary of the MRJWB, shall act as secretary;
 - iii. The Chair of the NDMRAC, or designee, shall be asked to be a member.
 - iv. The ND Recreation Representative to MRRIC, or designee, shall be asked to be a member.
 - v. The General Manager of the Garrison Conservancy District, or designee, shall be asked to be a member.
 - vi. The Director of the NDDWR, or designee, shall be asked to be a member.
 - vii. The Chair of the ND Water Education, or the Chair of the NDWU, or designee, shall be asked to be a member.
 - viii. Other Member or Members of the Water Community or Public as shall be determined by the Chair of the Joint Board.

- F. All Advisory members shall serve at the discretion of the Owner's Representative.
- G. It is envisioned that each Advisory Committee Member will be compensated by their respective organization. No additional or special compensation shall be provided to any Advisory Member, unless that member is requested to attend and represent the Plan or the MRJWB at any specified event. Compensation, if paid, will be as arranged between the Owner's Representative and the Member.
- H. All members shall track their donated time or other expenses for the purposes of receiving in-kind credits on funding applications, as may be possible.

Part 5. Dissemination of Information. Products developed by this part of the Plan will be disseminated and shared with the following entities:

- A. Developed material will be offered as public information by presentation or submission of material to appropriate counties, cities, selected organizations, and boards, selected civic groups, and other entities at the discretion of the MRJWB.
- B. All information which may be disseminated shall be provided to the NDDWR in advance.
- C. All activity of this Plan will be documented and made available in summary by a written report to the NDDWR on a quarterly basis. As may be required, personal presentation of the work effort and progress shall be provided.
- D. When requested, the MRJWB shall make themselves available for in person meetings or Plan updates to governing entities of the State including but not limited to the NDDWR and designated State legislative bodies.
- E. Public meetings are envisioned with a focus on providing information and engaging with the following (but not limited to):
 - i. ND League of Cities
 - ii. ND Association of Counties
 - iii. ND Convention and Visitor Bureau
 - iv. ND Water Organizations
 - v. ND MRAC
 - vi. Selected Cities and County governing boards
 - vii. Tribal entities

Part 6. Stakeholder Involvement. It is noted that of primary importance for the Plan is the need for stakeholder involvement in the development and dissemination of the work product of the Plan. Towards that end, one component of the Plan, contingent on funding and other issues, will be a Missouri River Stakeholders meeting with the following elements:

- A. The Stakeholders Meeting shall be scheduled and shall occur within 180 days of the start of any contract with a Program Manager.
- B. The Program Manager shall be responsible for the planning of the event, with input and direction from the Advisory Committee.
- C. It is envisioned that the services of the NDWU will be used to achieve this effort.

Part 7. Time Of Performance.

This Plan shall be for a time period starting May 1, 2022 and concluding on December 31, 2023; extension of this Plan and work product may be made by mutual agreement between the parties to this Plan. The Time of Performance starts when the MRJWB has determined that adequate financial commitment has been achieved for the Plan.

Part 8. Cost of Plan and Financial Management.

The total cost of this Plan is \$ 118,515 which is given as Attachment 2 to this Plan and which is for the listed Scope of Work efforts and Time of Performance as noted and is for all costs, inclusive of Program Manager costs, MRJWB internal or direct costs, all labor, materials, and travel by any party contributing to this Plan. The budget breakdown for this Plan is attached.

The MRJWB will provide the documentation and process as needed to conform to the requirements of any entity providing funds into the Plan.

Part 9. Product Ownership.

All product produced by this Plan shall be considered jointly owned and available for use by all participating funding entities of the Plan. All product is additionally considered public domain property and shall be provided to members of the public in accordance with applicable State law.

Part 10. Project Reporting and Deliverables.

During the life of the Plan, the Program Manager will submit quarterly progress reports to the MRJWB with the following information:

- A. Documentation of all presentations, white papers, testimonies, or other information generated and disseminated relative to the Plan.
- B. Documentation of all meetings attended with applicable notes including copies of any testimony offered by the MRJWB at such meetings.

- C. Copies of any comments, concerns, or other inputs received from the public or other entities that are received as result of work on this Plan, and copies of any response or follow-up action which might result.
- D. Other requirements from any participating funding or review entity which might apply to the work of this Plan.

At Plan completion or earlier, the following deliverables shall be provided (in addition to other incremental reporting requirements):

- E. An executive summary of the events held, presentations made, significant meetings or policy interactions, and similar activities.
- F. Such executive summary shall include issues or concerns raised by public or private entities during the course of the Plan work.
- G. Such executive summary shall include an analysis of the effectiveness of the Plan and recommendations, if any, for further activity relative to the Plan.
- H. During the course of the Plan, the Coordinator shall provide articles for publication in each edition of the ND Water magazine to provide increased focus on the current and potential benefits and challenges of the Missouri River to North Dakota.
- I. If continuation of the Plan is recommended, the executive summary shall provide any updates or revisions to the scope of work needed and shall include estimates of budget and funding issues for further pursuit.
- J. The Plan specifically includes documentation and agreement between the MRJWB and the NDDWR as to the envisioned partnership this Plan will have with the parties; such documentation shall be developed as an early item in the progression of the work.
- K. A schedule of the deliverables, in a quantified format, is attached as Attachment 1 to this Work Plan.



ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS NORTH DAKOTA INSURANCE RESERVE FUND MAY 19, 2021 CAPITAL ICE COMPLEX, BISMARCK, ND

NDIRF Board Chairperson Terry Traynor called the meeting of members of the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund to order at 9:30 a.m. at the Capital Ice Complex, Bismarck, ND. Chairperson Traynor welcomed everyone to the meeting and stated that, with the members in attendance and written proxies received, a quorum had been established.

The minutes from the 2020 annual meeting were reviewed. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as presented. (Chris West/Randy Bina, passed unanimously by voice vote.)

Chairperson Traynor stated that, even through all that occurred last year surrounding the Covid-19 pandemic, the NDIRF strived to continue its excellent communication with its members along with continuing the many services the NDIRF provides. Chairperson Traynor described those services as being defensive driving courses, web-based human resource tools, playground safety, continued partnerships with the ND League of Cities, ND Association of Counties, ND School Boards Association, and ND Parks and Recreation Association, and funding for safety and law enforcement training, among others. Throughout the years, the NDIRF's rates have stayed low, and consistent and, on top of that, because the NDIRF is member-owned, the members reap the benefits when there are good years financially such as year 2020 when a \$6.3 million conferment of benefits was declared. Chairperson Traynor thanked the NDIRF staff for what they do to keep the NDIRF going strong and thanked board members for their continued guidance. Outgoing NDIRF board member Randy Bina was presented with a gift of appreciation for his service and dedication to the NDIRF. Randy thanked everyone and stated that he has enjoyed his time on the board, working with the great staff at NDIRF, and overall found it to be a great experience and opportunity to be part of the organization.

CEO Brennan Quintus was introduced and thanked everyone for attending today's meeting. CEO Quintus stated that the NDIRF was formed 35 years ago, and he provided the history behind its formation emphasizing that members of the NDIRF turned to each other to find the solution to high insurance prices for political subdivisions and it has grown into a story of alliance and success. Brennan went on to say that various factors may have changed over the years on how we provide certain services but why we serve our members has not. The NDIRF is here "For North Dakota. For Local Government. For You." CEO Quintus reported that even though 2020 was a challenging year, it gave greater meaning to the NDIRF's achievements such as maintaining Fund membership with 2,556 political subdivisions that represent well over 90% of possible entities, and the NDIRF assisted members by providing guidance on Covid-19 vaccines and other Covid-related matters, reassuring members that the NDIRF is here for them. Praise was given to CIO Vance Krebs who did a fantastic job throughout the year keeping all the NDIRF staff up and running. NDIRF expanded services to its members by taking on the administering of the ND State Fire & Tornado Fund (F&T Fund) and the ND State Bonding Fund. Brennan reported on the 3-year plan for administering the funds and stated that the NDIRF is well ahead of schedule and the priority will now be focused on property valuation and enhancing coverage. To date, since the NDIRF took over administering the F&T Fund, there has been over \$2 billion of coverage added. Brennan reported that the NDIRF was also involved in establishing the ND Public Health Insurance Trust (NDPHIT) that is a health association of local governments within the state. There are 32 employers that have joined NDPHIT so far and around 60 schools expected to join in October 2021. The primary purpose of the NDPHIT is to provide more control for local governments regarding their healthcare coverage, rates, and service. It was noted that the NDIRF has no operational role but helps with the risk management side of things. Training was

once again a priority in 2020 and CEO Quintus listed many of the training and funding opportunities available to members such as supporting diversity training and helping fund a state-of-the art deescalation platform for the Grand Forks police department that will also be used to help train law enforcement across the state. It was announced that changes were made to the NDIRF's newsletter, the "Participator", that included an increase in the amount of content showcasing a member feature article, along with a variety of training and risk management topics. CEO Quintus stated that the NDIRF is and will remain laser focused on general liability, auto, and inland marine coverages and rates and proof of that laser focus is reflected in the conferment of benefits declared for 2020 that amounted to \$6.3 million being returned to members bringing the total to approximately \$71 million back to members overall. The final item brought forth by CEO Quintus was staff announcements. Two new staff members (Carrie Wingenbach and Renae Kistler) were introduced and then it was announced that two other staff members were retiring (Dawn Weigel retiring in May 2021 and Jeff Cahill at the beginning of 2022).

CFO Nora Frueh was then introduced and provided a summary of the NDIRF's 2020 financial affairs. CFO Frueh reported that even though the NDIRF's coverage rates remained stable, there was an increase in net premium that was mainly due to an increase in the values of autos, new coverage being added, and the purchase of excess limits by some members. CFO Frueh stated that the loss ratio was 35% for 2020, which is significantly lower than the last 5 years and the lowest since inception. Investments were also a reason for the great financial position in 2020 with over 9% in investment return, equaling just over \$4.2 million. It was reported that net earnings were over \$9 million with expenses coming in lower than budgeted. CFO Frueh stated that the NDIRF works with an actuarial consultant and the NDIRF, once again, was given an outstanding confidence level of over 90%.

Mr. Blake Ellefson from Eide Bailly, LLP was then introduced. Mr. Ellefson explained how the audit process works and what the responsibilities are of the auditing firm and those of NDIRF management. Mr. Ellefson then referred members to the 2020 NDIRF Annual Report and provided a summary of the 2020 NDIRF financial audit that included a review of the balance sheets, statements of activities and statements of cash flows for years 2019 and 2020. Total assets for 2020 were approximately \$56 million; total liabilities were approximately \$30 million; and total net assets/members' equity was \$26 million. Mr. Ellefson stated that Eide Bailly also has an actuary who works with NDIRF management and management's actuary to conduct a review of reserves and test year-end account balances. Mr. Ellefson reported that there were no significant difficulties encountered during the audit, there were no uncorrected and corrected misstatements, and there were no disagreements with management.

The meeting was recessed at 10:07 a.m. so the "Cities", "Counties", and "Others" could caucus for election of members. When the meeting reconvened at 10:20 a.m., Chairperson Traynor reported that, with the proxies received as of May 18, 2020, the results were accepted and will stand showing Chris West elected to represent the "Cities" category; Scott Ouradnik elected to represent the "Counties" category; and Tyler Jacobson elected to represent the "Others" category.

Meeting attendees were given an opportunity to ask questions and the door prize was won by Jason Mittelsteadt.

There being no further business to come before the 2020 NDIRF Annual Meeting of Members, the meeting was adjourned at 10:21 a.m.
