Dear Laura:

After reviewing the Draft Preliminary City of Bismarck and Burleigh County floodplain/floodway mapping provided by FEMA/NDSWC we are documenting the following areas of interest and requesting certain actions as part of the sixty (60) day comment period. We have been visiting with both the City and County regarding various mapping questions to coordinate this response.

- 1. Missouri River Correctional Center Levee This constructed flood control levee does not show on the Draft Preliminary Missouri River mapping, which is likely due to its construction after the 2016 LiDAR (circa 2017). There are areas along the levee that are above the BFE. We can provide the topographic surface from our record drawings or it could be obtained via the 2020 LiDAR, though the former is more accurate. There was no Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) for this project as it is not accredited protection. As real and functional protection paid for through state funding and a special assessment district it is important this levee be shown, regardless as to the property behind it remaining in the AE Zone. This is a public flood control system that needs to be shown or it presents a false impression regarding the protection that is in place.
- 2. Fox Island Flood Control Project Levee This constructed flood control levee does not show on the preliminary Missouri River mapping, which is likely due to its construction after the 2016 LiDAR (circa 2019). There are areas along the levee that are above the BFE. We can provide the topographic surface file from our record drawings or it could be obtained via the 2020 LiDAR, though the former is more accurate. There was no Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) for this project as it is not accredited protection. As real and functional protection paid for through a special assessment district it is important that this levee be shown, regardless as to the property behind it remaining in the AE Zone. This is a public flood control system that needs to be shown or it presents a false impression regarding the protection that is in place.

- 3. Cottonwood Parkview Addition The eastern portion of this subdivision was removed from the Missouri River floodplain via a LOMR(f) (circa 2019). A topographic surface of the actual removal via the approved LOMR is available to update the draft mapping. This grading is also likely available on the 2020 LiDAR, depending upon when the flight was taken, though the data file in the LOMR submittal would be more accurate. Removal in this instance followed the property boundaries to assure removal of each lot. While this LOMR will likely be considered during the SOMA process and revalidated, it is important to document this now to update the mapping for accuracy. If not shown there would be unnecessary confusion related to multiple new residential lots and structures, along with others remaining to be constructed on the removed lots.
- 4. Cottonwood Lake This is an isolated manmade lake that is no hydraulic surface connection to the South Bismarck Stormwater Channel. Therefore, the properties around this isolated lake are not subject to the Missouri River Floodplain mapping. While there is a groundwater influence from the stormwater channel into the lake, this lags from channel flows and occurs only during prolonged high water. Subsequently, this interior area should not be mapped as floodplain on either the 0.1% or 0.2% events.
- 5. **Bismarck Sanitary Sewage Treatment Plant** There is a sizable area located east of the sewage treatment plant north of Burleigh Avenue and south of London Avenue. Both these streets are shown as being above the Base Flood Elevation (BFE) and within the 0.2% (500-year) chance event. The question is whether there is a hydraulic connection under these roadways that would create the floodplain in this area. The City of Bismarck may wish to review this area to determine the existence of culverts, and if there is no physical connection this area might be removed from the floodplain. The existing effective FIS mapping indicates the eastern portions of the sanitary treatment plant as being in the floodplain. The lower BFE's under the Draft Preliminary mapping remove a portion of this area, and this site is functionally protected by the *Burleigh County 20-foot Plan* features to the west at Tavis Road and the Fox Island Flood Control Project. The City may want to pursue an accredited project to fully remove this critical municipal infrastructure from the floodplain.
- 6. **Hay Creek Silver Ranch Breakout** We understand a CLOMR was filed for work in this area related to the construction of an electrical substation and SOMA process.
- 7. **2020 LIDAR Topography** During the community officials meeting it was noted the 2016 (Burleigh County) and 2018 LIDAR (MPO) were utilized for the draft preliminary floodplain mapping. While the 2020 LIDAR is available, we understand remapping using this newer topographic data is not applicable given budgetary constraints.

Those areas where the topography has changed are likely isolated and can be addressed by individual property owners under the LOMA process or the previous LOMR submittals via the SOMA process. The revised mapping will include revalidating approved LOMR(f)'s so those changes will be addressed in that process, though not shown on the maps. In addition, localized sites adequately elevated above the BFE could be removed from the floodplain or from within the newly designated Apple Creek breakout floodway. We understand these removals are best addressed via the LOMA process by the individual homeowner. The LOMA process would provide more specific information and documentation for such removals.

- 8. **BNSF Railroad Bridge** The proposed railroad bridge replacement is not included in the Draft preliminary floodplain mapping. This installation is being addressed under a separate CLOMR using the existing effective FIS model. When the new bridge is constructed, with or without the existing bridge remaining, it is anticipated the mapping would be modified, if necessary, using the updated hydraulic modeling. Given its nature, span, and piers the bridge impacts are not anticipated to be a significant concern.
- 9. Hay Creek Floodway Effective Conveyance Utilizing the "effective conveyance" approach floodway mapping in the lower reaches of Hay Creek is prudent. Especially considering the encroachment occurring prior to the original 1995 LOMR mapping. Subsequently, allowing additional cumulative encroachment is not prudent floodplain management. The use of the standard floodway encroachment methods north of 71st Avenue is reasonable given the undeveloped or rural residential properties in this area. There are many rural residential properties affected by the new mapping, which will require an education process for the residents to understand the mapping revision implications.
- 10. **Burnt Creek Floodway** The floodway boundary north of Burnt Creek is noticeably wider than the existing boundary. Not sure what created the expansion in this area; however, it requested this revision be explained as it is anticipated the affected landowners will inquire about this change, so it is prudent to know for the BCWRD to be able to respond. It was also noted that there was a measurable expansion of the 0.2% flood boundary on Hogue Island.
- 11. Whispering Bay, SouthBay and Misty Waters Developments Each of the marina based residences abutting the water were subject to their original LOMR(f) or subsequent LOMR(f) revisions. The new floodplain boundary established based on the new topography will supersede these LOMR(f)'s. In some instances, construction or changes occurred after the 2016 or 2018 LiDAR collects, which could place a residence in the floodplain. If the applicable LOMR(f) was properly filed these situations should be rectified through the SOMA process.

- 12. **SouthBay Development -** This is an isolated manmade groundwater lake and there is no surface hydraulic connection to the Missouri River. Therefore, the properties abutting the lake interior are not subject to Missouri River floodplain and mapping. While there is a groundwater influence from the Missouri River, this is significantly buffered by the underlying soils with water level increases only occurring during prolonged high water in the river. During the 2011 historic flood event recorded water levels did not reach the adjoining river levels to the north or west, or to the existing BFE's. Subsequently, the interior lake area should not be mapped as Missouri River floodplain on either the 0.1% or 0.2% events.
- 13. Wilton, Wing or Mackenzie Slough No comments
- 14. Apple Creek Mapping and Floodway Relocation The changes associated with the lower reaches of Apple Creek raise several questions without answers. There have been new structures constructed in this area, one is located within the breakout floodway. There were also several lots purchased, then the new owner found out they were in the existing mapped floodway. It is our understating the Draft Preliminary Maps can be shared with these residents with the clarification that these maps are not finalized. This additional notice will assist to improve the ability to inform and educate the impacted property owners in this area. The City and County are considering the opportunity to hold a public informational meeting to discuss the Draft Prelminiary mapping with these residents.
- 15. **Sibley Island Flood Control Project** Project development has been on hold since it was determined the remapping of the Apple Creek Floodplain/Floodway presented issues related to the breakout floodway. Subsequently, the proposed alignment of the levee protection must be relocated to avoid the new floodway. This realignment results in property that was to be protected by the flood control measures no longer being protected. In addition, State Water Commission cost share funds will now become carry over as the preliminary engineering report has been delayed, which has impacted consideration by the benefited properties for project implementation.

We appreciate the opportunity to share this information and look forward to the Preliminary Mapping and public review process occurring.

Map Update

The City of Bismarck appreciates the opportunity to comment on the draft preliminary mapping products associated with the FEMA Risk map update initiated in 2017. Staff have reviewed this information from a technical perspective and have the following comments/questions related to the mapping products:

- 1. The Current effective FIRM (8/4/14) for the City of Bismarck and Burleigh County Unincorporated areas has an ET□line (Extraterritorial □urisdiction) identified on the map. We would like to have the ET□line adjusted to identify our current negotiated ET□agreement between the City of Bismarck and Burleigh County.
- 2. There are several areas in the City of Bismarck and Burleigh county that have been removed from the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) AE zone by a letter of map change. The DRAFT risk map shows many of these areas have been integrated into the map and shown as areas not located in the AE zone due to the recent LiDAR collected and used in the development of the risk map.
 - Will the letters of map change in these areas be revalidated □
 - Some properties that had been removed from the AE zone by a letter of map revision (LOMR) or Letter of Map Revision based on fill (LOMR-F) are shown to have portions of buildings located in the proposed AE zone. Our expectation would be that these individual properties do not invalidate the remainder of the associated larger scale (multiple properties or entire subdivisions) previously adopted map changes, in which the subject structures are located.
- 3. Due to the decertification of the South Washington St drainage channel gate structure, a significant number of properties are now shown to be located in the AE zone. We intend to work toward efforts to recertify this structure. We would request additional time for the updated Risk Map to be adopted to allow this

structure to be recertified. Please advise as to the process to accommodate this request.

- 4. Is it expected that our community use the preliminary flood insurance study and flood profiles as our best available date for floodplain management ☐ If so, at what point should the preliminary information be used ☐ If it is the intent that the preliminary information be used in advance of formal adoption as the effective FIRM, does the most restrictive FIRM between preliminary and Effective apply between similar areas with conflicting data ☐
- 5. There are a variety of areas including but not limited to, Cottonwood Lake, the City of Bismarck wastewater treatment plant lagoons, and Southbay that do not appear hydraulically connected to the Missouri River. Why are these areas included within an AE zone on the draft preliminary information □

Sixty-seventh Legislative Assembly of North Dakota In Regular Session Commencing Tuesday, January 5, 2021

HOUSE BILL NO. 1437 (Representatives Schreiber-Beck, D. Anderson, Beltz, D. Johnson, J. Nelson, O'Brien, Schmidt) (Senators Klein, Kreun)

AN ACT to create and enact section 61-32-03.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to small subsurface water management systems; to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section 61-02-01.4 and section 61-32-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to large subsurface water management system permits and the state water commission cost-share policy; to provide a penalty; to provide an expiration date; and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 61-02-01.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

3. Must consider all project costs potentially eligible for reimbursement, except the commission shall exclude operations expense, regular maintenance, and removal of vegetative materials and sediment, for assessment drains, and may exclude operations expense and regular maintenance for other projects. Snagging and clearing of watercourses are not regular-maintenanceand deepening or widening of existing drains are eligible for reimbursement. The commission shall require a water project sponsor to maintain a capital improvement fund from the rates charged customers for future extraordinary maintenance projects as condition of funding an extraordinary maintenance project.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 61-32-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

61-32-03.1. Permit to drain subsurface waters required - Permit form - Penalty.

- 1.a. Installation of a subsurface water management system comprising eighty acres [32.37 hectares] of land area or more requires a permit. The watershed area drained by a subsurface water management system may not be used to determine whether the system requires a permit under this section. A person that violates this section is guilty of an infraction.
 - b. Subsurface water management systems that use surface intakes <u>or lift stations</u> must be permitted exclusively under this section if the system will have a drainage coefficient of three-eighths of an inch [0.95 centimeters] or less. Subsurface water management-systems that use surface intakes must be permitted exclusively under section 61-32-03 if the system will have a drainage coefficient exceeding three-eighths of an inch [0.95-centimeters].
 - c. Installation of a subsurface water management system comprising less than eighty acres [32.37 hectares] of land area does not require a permit.
 - 2. <u>For purposes of this section, a "natural watercourse" includes, in addition to watercourses defined in section 61-01-06, any waterway depicted as a perennial or intermittent stream or river on a United States geological survey topography map.</u>
 - 3. The state engineer shall develop an application form for a permit required under this section. A person seeking to construct a subsurface water management system that requires a permit under this section mustshall submit a completed application to the water resource district board within which is found a majority of the land area for consideration and approval. The water resource district board may charge permit applicants a fee up to one five hundred fifty dollars. Water resource districts shall forward

- copies of all approved permits to the state engineer The fee must be paid before the water resource district may approve the application.
- b. Upon submission of a completed application for a permit, the water resource district-board immediately shall give notice and a copy of the submission via certified mail to each owner of land within one mile [1.61 kilometers] downstream of the proposed-subsurface water management system outlet unless the distance to the nearest-waterway depicted as a perennial or intermittent stream or river on a United States-geological survey topography map, assessment drain, natural watercourse, slough, or lake is less than one mile [1.61 kilometers], in which case notice and a copy of the submission must be given immediately to each owner of land between the outlet and the nearest assessment drain, natural watercourse, slough, or lake. The notice requirement in this section must be waived if the applicant presents signed, notarized letters of approval from all downstream landowners entitled to notice in this subsection.
- 3. If the water resource board receives notarized letters of approval from all downstream landowners entitled to notice, the board shall approve the completed permit application as soon as practicable but no later than thirty days after receipt of the last letter. Otherwise, the water resource board shall review the completed application at its next meeting that is at least thirty days after receipt of the application. The board shallconsider any written, technical evidence provided by the applicant or a landowner notified under subsection 2 addressing whether the land of a notified landowner will be flooded or unreasonably harmed by the proposed subsurface water management system. Forpurposes of this section "technical evidence" means written information regarding the proposed subsurface water management system, prepared after consideration of the design and physical aspects of the proposed system, and any adverse hydraulic effects, including erosion, flood duration, crop loss, and downstream water control deviceoperation impacts, which may occur to land owned by a landowner provided undersubsection 2. Technical evidence must be submitted to the permit applicant, notified landowners, and the board within thirty days of the receipt of the completed permitapplication by the board. A notified landowner may not object to the proposed system unless the landowner presents technical evidence under this subsection.
 - b. If the board finds, based on technical evidence, the proposed subsurface water-management system will flood or unreasonably harm lands of a landowner notified under subsection 2, the board may require the applicant to obtain a notarized letter of approval before issuing a permit for the system. The board may not require a letter of approval for any land downstream of a system that outlets into an assessment drain, natural-watercourse, or pond, slough, or lake if notified landowners did not provide technical-evidence to the district.
 - c. A water resource district may attach reasonable conditions to an approved permit for a subsurface water management system that outlets directly into a legal assessment drain or public highway right of way. For purposes of this subsection, "reasonable conditions" means conditions that address the outlet location, proper erosion control, reseeding of disturbed areas, installation of riprap or other ditch stabilization, and conditions that require all work to be done in a neat and professional manner. Any condition to locate the project a minimum distance from rural water supply lines may not extend beyond an existing easement for lines, or no greater than twenty feet [6.1 meters] from either side of the water line if the rural water line was installed under a blanket easement.
 - d. A water resource district may require a subsurface water management system granted a permit under this section to incorporate a control structure at the outlet into the design of the system and may require the control structure be closed during critical flood periods.
 - e. A water resource district board may not deny a completed permit application under this section unless the board determines, based on technical evidence submitted by a

landowner notified under subsection 2, the proposed water management system will flood or unreasonably harm land of a notified landowner, and a notarized letter of approval required by the board has not been obtained by the applicant. For purposes of this section, "unreasonable harm" is limited to hydraulic impacts, including erosion or other adverse impacts that degrade the physical integrity of a roadway or real property within one mile [1.61 kilometers] downstream of the system's outlet. The board shall-include a written explanation of the reasons for a denial of a completed application and notify, by certified mail, the applicant and all landowners notified under subsection 2 of the approval or denial.

- f. The board may not deny a permit more than sixty days after receipt of the completed application for the permit. If the board fails to deny the permit application within sixty days of receipt, the permit application is deemed approved.
- 4. A denial of a completed permit application by a water resource district board may be-appealed, under section 28-34-01, to the district court of the county in which the permit-application was filed. The court may approve a completed permit application denied by awater resource district board or the state engineer if the application meets the requirements of this section.
- 5. A completed permit application includes:
 - (1) A completed application form signed by an applicant and filed with the district;
 - (2) Evidence of ownership for each parcel to be tiled according to the tax rolls of the county in which the parcel is located;
 - (3) A project design, including:
 - (a) A detailed drawing depicting the subsurface water management system's location overlain on an aerial photograph of the parcel;
 - (b) The system's location by legal description identifying either the relevant quarter, section, township, and range or the relevant block and lot number;
 - (c) The physical footprint of the system's layout;
 - (d) The tile-main sizes and locations;
 - (e) The laterals to the tile-main sizes and locations;
 - (f) Surface inlet sizes and locations; and
 - (g) Outlet sizes, locations, and types;
 - (4) A downstream flow map or depiction of the flow direction from each outlet location for one mile [1.61 kilometers] downstream which includes the location of the downstream parcels by legal description identifying either the relevant quarter, section, township, and range or the relevant block and lot number; and
 - (5) Evidence of ownership for each parcel within one mile [1.61 kilometers] downstream of each project outlet according to the tax rolls for the county in which the parcel is located, unless the distance to the nearest assessment drain, natural watercourse, slough, or lake is less than one mile [1.61 kilometers] downstream of a proposed outlet, in which case the applicant shall provide evidence of ownership for each parcel between the outlet and the nearest assessment drain, natural watercourse, slough, or lake.

- <u>c.</u> <u>Unless the district notifies an applicant the application is incomplete and provides a list of information required to complete the application within three business days after the day the district receives the application, the application is deemed complete.</u>
- d. Detailed drawings submitted pursuant to subparagraph a of paragraph 3 of subdivision be as part of an application for a permit under this section after the effective date of this Act are exempt records under section 44-04-18 and may be provided to individuals only as necessary to make a decision whether to approve the permit.
- 4. A district may attach conditions to an approved permit for a subsurface water management system if the conditions address:
 - <u>a.</u> Outlet locations including requirements for pump and control structures to be installed no closer than twenty-five feet [7.62 meters] from the top of the back slope of an assessment drain:
 - b. Installation and maintenance of proper erosion control at all outlets;
 - c. Re-establishment of disturbed areas to previous conditions;
 - d. The minimum distance from rural water supply lines. However, a district may not attach a condition requiring a system to extend beyond an existing easement for a rural waterline, or, if the rural waterline was installed under a blanket easement, requiring a system to extend beyond twenty feet [6.1 meters] from either side of a rural waterline;
 - e. Installation and operation of control structures at project outlets including requirements for control structures to be closed or pump outlets to be turned off during critical flood periods;
 - f. Requirements for a permittee to obtain an amendment to a permit for alterations to outlet locations, new outlets, or improvements resulting in drainage of additional acres;
 - g. If the subsurface water management system will discharge into the watershed area of an assessment drain, inclusion of the relevant property into the assessment district for the assessment drain in accordance with the benefits the property receives, provided the property is not assessed already for the assessment drain. The water resource district may include the new property into the assessment district, and determine the benefits and assessment amounts under chapters 61-21 and 61-16.1, without conducting the reassessment of benefit proceedings under sections 61-21-44 and 61-16.1-26, provided the property is not assessed already for the assessment drain.
 - h. Requirements for a permittee to remove silt and vegetation, or repair erosion and scour damages directly caused by the subsurface water management system, up to one mile [1.61 kilometers] downstream from a proposed outlet, unless the distance to the nearest assessment drain, natural watercourse, slough, or lake is less than one mile [1.61 kilometers] downstream of the proposed outlet, in which case the district may require silt and vegetation removal or erosion and scour damage repair between the outlet and the nearest assessment drain, natural watercourse, slough, or lake. For purposes of this subdivision and subdivision i:
 - (1) Downstream damage repair does not include deepening or widening a road ditch or existing drain;
 - (2) The timing and method of silt and vegetation removal or damage repair in a county or township road ditch must be preapproved by the appropriate road authority; and
 - (3) The applicant shall follow any construction site protection requirements of the road authority.

- i. If a downstream landowner or road authority presents substantial evidence a subsurface water management system directly has caused accumulation of silt, vegetation erosion, or scouring, the requirement or authorization of the applicant to remove the silt and vegetation or repair the erosion and scour damages directly caused by the system. However, the applicant may not spread silt, vegetation, or debris along adjoining land without the permission of all parties having a legal interest in the land.
- 5. A district shall approve a permit, including any permissible conditions, within thirty days after the district receives the completed application. If the district fails to approve the permit application within that period, the permit is deemed approved with no conditions.
- 6. Upon approval of a permit, the district shall forward notice of the approved permit and the downstream flow map to the state engineer and to each landowner who owns property within one mile [1.61 kilometers] downstream of each project outlet according to the tax rolls of the county in which the property is located, unless the distance to the nearest assessment drain, natural watercourse, slough, or lake is less than one mile [1.61 kilometers] downstream of the proposed outlet, in which case the district shall provide notice to landowners with property between the outlet and the nearest assessment drain, natural watercourse, slough, or lake. The district shall send copies of the notice by first-class mail, attested by an affidavit of mailing. The district does not need to provide copies of the permit application under this subsection.
- 7. An amendment of a previously approved subsurface water management system permit must be made according to the provisions for approving a permit under this section.
- <u>8.</u> A water resource district board may not be held liable to any person for issuing a permit under this section.
- 6. A person that installs a subsurface water management system requiring a permit under this section without first securing the permit is liable for all damages sustained by a person caused by the subsurface water management system.
- 7. A person that installs a subsurface water management system requiring a permit under this section without first securing the permit is guilty of an infraction.
- 9. Approval of a permit under this section does not prohibit a downstream party unreasonably damaged by the discharge of water from a subsurface water management system from seeking damages in a civil action.
- 10. This section applies only to subsurface water management systems that drain, in whole or in part, platted or unplatted lands used for raising agricultural crops or grazing farm animals.

SECTION 3. Section 61-32-03.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

61-32-03.2. Smaller subsurface water management systems - Notification and conditions - Penalty.

- 1. A person may not install a subsurface water management system comprising less than eighty acres [32.37 hectares] of land area until the person has notified the board of the water resource district within which is found a majority of the land area of the system of the following information:
 - a. The system's total acreage and legal description of the land being drained;
 - b. The outlet locations and types; and
 - c. The flow direction from each outlet location.

- 2. A person required to notify the board under subsection 1 shall install the subsurface water management system such that:
 - <u>a.</u> Pump and control structures at pump outlets are installed no closer than twenty-five feet [7.62 meters] from the top of the back slope of an assessment drain;
 - b. Proper erosion controls are installed and maintained at all outlets; and
 - c. Pumps and control structures at project outlets are closed or turned off during critical flood periods.
- 3. If a subsurface water management system for which notification is required under subsection 1 will discharge into the watershed area of an assessment drain, the water resource board that receives the notice may require the relevant property to be included in the assessment district for the assessment drain in accordance with the benefits the property receives, provided the property is not assessed already for the assessment drain. The water resource district also may include the property in the assessment district and determine the benefits and assessment amounts under chapters 61-21 and 61-16.1, without conducting the reassessment of benefit proceedings under sections 61-21-44 and 61-16.1-26, provided the property is not assessed already for the assessment drain.
- 4. The board of the water resource district within which the subsurface water management system is located may order the system's owner or operator to bring the system into compliance with subsection 2 if the board finds the system violates that subsection.
- 5. A person that violates this section is guilty of an infraction.
- 6. This section applies only to subsurface water management systems that drain, in whole or in part, platted or unplatted lands used for raising agricultural crops or grazing farm animals.
- 7. This section does not apply to a subsurface water management system that discharges into a body of water completely encompassed by land owned by the person that owns the land drained by the system.
- 8. The information that must be provided to a board of a water resource district under this section is an exempt record under section 44-04-18.

SECTION 4. EXPIRATION DATE. Section 3 of this Act is effective through December 31, 2022, and after that date is ineffective.

SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.

1 Devils Lake Area Tour - June 16

This year's tour will review the infrastructure and flood protection projects constructed to address high water, including the nearly 12-mile earthen levee that protects the city of Devils Lake. The tour will also include visits to the Tolna Coulee Control Structure, Tolna Dam, the East Devils Lake Outlet (built to pump water from the lake into the Sheyenne River watershed) and local watershed management projects. The group will see the influence of agriculture and precision ag management. Tour attendees will visit area businesses that have taken advantage of lake levels to promote tourism, recreation, camping and fishing to visitors from across the Upper Midwest. The tour starts and ends in Devils Lake.

Managing Water in Agriculture and Industry – June 24

Rising land values have increased interest in subsoil water management in North Dakota. This tour beginning and ending in West Fargo will include the fundamentals of tile drainage as a crop production technology. System design concepts




and economics will be reviewed, as well as water quality and environmental impacts. Both field scale and research model systems will be visited. Tour participants will learn about the Sheyenne River Diversion, which is one of the major tributaries of the Red River. Farmers, landowners, contractors and land and water resource managers will be part of the tour. The group also will visit an ethanol plant and learn about its innovative water reuse program.

Missouri River Expedition – The River's Past and Present – June 29

On this tour, attendees will learn about the historical and beneficial uses of the Heart and Missouri rivers and efforts to protect property from flooding. The tour will visit the confluence of the Missouri and the Heart rivers near On-A-Slant Indian Village and Fort Abraham Lincoln State Park to understand the historical dependence on the rivers for commerce and transportation. Participants will learn about efforts to enhance Heart River flood protection and visit irrigated agriculture. The tour will visit area water recreation facilities and a water treatment plant providing water to Mandan and rural water systems for municipal, rural and industrial use. This tour will visit the Harmon Lake Dam recreation area. The tour begins and ends in Mandan.

North Dakota Water Education Foundation 2021 Summer Water Tours

North Dakota Water Education Foundation tours offers a firsthand look at North Dakota's critical water issues and initiatives. While the coronavirus pandemic of 2020 brought a temporary halt to these important visits, the issues facing water development and water management continue, as will water tours in 2021. Visit sites across the state in a series of one-day tours that include a variety of professionals and local leaders representing in depth perspective on local and state water issues. Tour participants will learn about water supply, water quality, flood protection, water conservation, irrigation and beneficial water use. Individual registration is \$20 per person and includes tour transportation, lunch, refreshments, informational material and a one-year subscription to the *North Dakota Water* magazine.



Red River of the North: 'Simply Grand' – July 15

While in Grand Forks, tour participants will learn about aspects of the Grand Forks and East Grand Forks flood protection system and features of the Red River of the North Greenway, which was developed since the catastrophic 1997 flood. Learn how the system performed in spring floods that previously might have been devastating. This half-day tour also will visit the newly completed Grand Forks Regional Water Treatment Facility placed miles away from the river to reduce risk of future flood inundation. The tour starts and ends in Grand Forks.

Taming the Red – Fargo-Moorhead Area Diversion Project – July 20

The recurring threat of major flooding along the Red River creates anxiety in the Fargo-Moorhead metro and rural Cass County communities during many spring snow melts. Tour participants will learn about ongoing efforts to enhance flood protection within the cities and visit existing flood control facilities, including the control structures under construction for the Fargo-Moorhead Metro Flood Diversion. Tour participants will learn about the overall operation of the project and how it and in-town levees will work together to reduce the risk of floods for the metro area. The tour begins and ends in Fargo.

Managing Water Through Garrison Diversion – July 27

The Garrison Diversion Unit has changed since its 1944 inception in the Flood Control Act. On this tour beginning and ending in Riverdale, participants will learn the history of the project and the use of major investments, including



Garrison Dam and its hydroelectric power plant; the Snake Creek Pumping Plant, which supplies water to Lake Audubon and the McClusky Canal; and wildlife refuges, recreation areas and local irrigation. Participants will see how the Garrison Diversion Unit Project has led to benefits for multiple areas and interests across the state.

Managing the Mighty Mouse - August 10

The Mouse River begins in Saskatchewan, Canada, winds its way into north-central North Dakota, then turns north and returns to Canada. In Canada, the river is known as the Souris, the French word for mouse; however, a 1961 North Dakota law states the river, while in North Dakota, is to be called the Mouse River. This tour will focus on sites around Minot and the surrounding region, including the Water Treatment Plant/HMGP Floodwall, Mouse River Enhanced Flood Protection Project – Burlington Phases and the Mouse River Enhanced Flood Protection Project Phases 1, 2 and 3 through Minot. The tour begins and ends in Minot.



NDIRF BOARD NOMINEE PROFILES 2021

"CITIES" CATEGORY

CHRIS WEST is the Mayor of Grafton, North Dakota, currently serving his third term in that capacity following two terms on the Grafton City Council. Mr. West is an insurance professional, owning Northern States Insurance in Grafton since 2002. Chris is a Past President of the North Dakota League of Cities and has been a member of the NDIRF Board of Directors since 2014.

"COUNTIES" CATEGORY

SCOTT OURADNIK is a Slope County Commissioner, currently serving his third term in that capacity. Mr. Ouradnik is a current member of the NACO Western Interstate Region Board of Directors, a member of the Slope County Fair Board, a member of the Amidon Rural Fire Department, and a member of the Amidon First Responders. Mr. Ouradnik and his family own a ranch in Slope County concentrating on angus cows/calf pairs. Scott has been a member of the NDIRF Board of Directors since 2018.

"OTHERS" CATEGORY

TY DEWITZ is the Clerk for the Westford Township and a member of the Kidder County School Board. Mr. DeWitz is a graduate of the North Dakota College of Science and has served in various roles within his community, including as Chairman of the Central Dakota Irrigation District, Chairman of the Stony Acres Grazing Association, and Chairman of the Tappen Farmers COOP. Ty and his wife, Debra, farm and ranch with their family near Tappen. Ty has served on the NDIRF Board of Directors in the "Schools" category since 2019.

TYLER JACOBSON is the Director of the Valley City Parks and Recreation District, serving in that capacity since 2001. Before joining the Valley City Parks and Recreation District, Tyler served as the Director of the Casselton Park District. He is a graduate of the University of North Dakota. He has been involved in various advisory or service roles throughout North Dakota, including with the University of North Dakota, the North Dakota Recreation and Park Association, and other community organizations in Valley City and Casselton. Tyler is also currently an instructor at Valley City State University.

ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS NORTH DAKOTA INSURANCE RESERVE FUND MAY 20, 2020

The annual meeting of members of the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund was called to order by Board Chairperson Chris West at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, May 20, 2020, via Zoom video conferencing. NDIRF Administrative Services Manager Nancy Reis stated that, in accordance with the NDIRF Bylaws, the virtual members in attendance and written proxies received, a quorum had been established.

The minutes from the 2019 NDIRF Annual Meeting were reviewed. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes. (Terry Traynor/Chad Peterson, passed unanimously by voice vote.)

Chairperson Chris West stated that, especially today, because of the current situation that we all find ourselves in, wanted to thank everyone for attending the NDIRF Annual Meeting. Chairperson West reported on the NDIRF's 34-year history stating that there are currently 2,555 members representing over 90% of entities eligible for membership throughout the state. He added that it has been at that level for many years because members are happy with the stable rates offered, are satisfied with the services the NDIRF provides and has proven its ability to meet a critical need for its members. Chairperson West remarked on the NDIRF's continued commitment to assisting members through different training opportunities. He stated that the insurance market tends to cycle up and down where NDIRF remains stable and sound. Chairperson West then announced that the NDIRF will be returning approximately \$3.1 million to its members in the form of a conferment of benefit for 2019 and that, over all the years, has returned almost \$65 million to members. He then thanked NDIRF Board Members for their leadership and service and thanked staff for their dedication and service to the NDIRF.

CEO Brennan Quintus was introduced, and he welcomed everyone to the meeting. CEO Quintus thanked Chairperson West for his leadership and the board for their guidance this past year and extended a thanks to the NDIRF staff for a job well done. CEO Quintus reported on recent staff changes (the hiring of Joanna Drennen as NDIRF's Marketing & Communication Manager in January 2020 and Claims Support Specialist Rebekah Wallen transitioning from the Claims Department to the Underwriting Department and will take over as the Special Funds Underwriter on January 1, 2021.) CEO Quintus then provided a recap of the 2019 business operations. He reported that, as Chairperson West stated earlier, a Conferment of Benefits was declared by the NDIRF Board of Directors and the NDIRF will be returning almost \$3.1 million to members. It is mainly due to an increase in the NDIRF's investment portfolio and is the largest conferment since the conferment of benefits program was put into place. CEO Quintus then reported that the NDIRF took over administering the ND State Fire & Tornado Fund (F&T) in July 2019 that involves handling the underwriting, premium collection, claims handling, and loss control activities. The money for the Fire & Tornado Fund stays with the state – not the NDIRF, however the NDIRF does receive an administrative fee. CEO Quintus stated that during the first year of administering the F&T Fund, NDIRF will focus on understanding its operation and process. During year 2, the NDIRF will target immediate changes (property valuations, coverage issues, rating); and during year 3, the F&T Fund will operate more like the NDIRF with updated coverage forms, rating structure, and valuation/inspection processes in place.

Other items of interest reported on by CEO Quintus were that, in 2019, the NDIRF began studying how it could assist members with additional services. A survey of NDIRF members was conducted in 2018 and it indicated they wanted health insurance options for their membership. A feasibility study was completed, and the results of the study were incredibly positive. While researching health insurance options and the possibility of putting together a trust association, it was discovered that the South East Education Cooperative (SEEC) was doing the same thing. Late in 2019, CEO Quintus and Kyle Davison from SEEC met to discuss a possible partnership and the ND Public Health Insurance Trust (NDPHIT) was formed. The

health insurance trust will be a similar concept to the NDIRF (pooling funds) and will provide members with more control, lower rates, and better coverage and will be available to most North Dakota public entities January 1, 2021. CEO Quintus went on to report that, in 2019, the NDIRF transitioned its internal operating software to provide for a more efficient process and also continued with its exceptional member services activities by offering training opportunities and partnering with statewide associations and organizations such as the ND League of Cities, ND Association of Counties, ND School Boards Association, ND Recreation & Parks Association, and ND Firefighters Association. A breakdown was then displayed providing member premium distribution showing Cities at 34%; Counties at 29%; Others were 22%; and Schools were 15%. The final item was a video that was played for meeting attendees highlighting NDIRF, its members and services.

CFO Nora Frueh was introduced. CFO Frueh reviewed financial information for 2019. Net earned written premium was at \$16.3 million; losses were \$9.03 million, which produced a loss ratio of 55.5%. CFO Frueh reported that it was a great year for the NDIRF investment portfolio with a return of 10.92% (\$4.4 million in investment income.) The NDIRF investment portfolio is comprised of fixed income at 78%; equities are 16% and cash or equivalents are 6%. Net earnings were approximately \$6.014 million with the majority coming from investment returns. The NDIRF remains in a very strong financial position with over \$23 million in surplus and continues to maintain a 90% confidence level, according to the Fund's actuarial consultant. Assets, as of 12/31/19, were \$50.7 million; liabilities were \$27.6 million; and members' equity was \$23.1 million.

Mr. Dave Glennon from Eide Bailly LLP was introduced. Mr. Glennon explained the audit process and stated that it is NDIRF's management responsibility for the preparation and fair presentation of its financial statements and it is Eide Bailly's responsibility to express an opinion on those financial statements based on their audits, which are conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States. Mr. Glennon referred members to the 2019 NDIRF Annual Report which provided a snapshot of financial statements for years 2018 and 2019 and included a review of the balance sheets, statements of activities and statements of cash flows. Mr. Glennon stated that Eide Bailly reviewed the actuarial report that Aon (NDIRF's actuarial consultant) completed and were comfortable with the processes and methods used. Mr. Glennon stated that, in Eide Bailly's opinion, the financial statements for years 2018 and 2019 present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the NDIRF and that the NDIRF was given, once again, an unmodified (clean) opinion, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

Chairperson West stated that the Election of Members was next on the agenda and, with the proxies received as of May 18, 2020, the results were accepted and will stand showing Burdell Johnson was elected to represent the "Others" category and Ty DeWitz was elected to represent the "Schools" category.

Meeting attendees were then given an opportunity to ask questions. CEO Quintus reminded members if anyone has any questions or concerns throughout the year, to contact him or CFO Nora Frueh.

There being no further business to come before the 2020 NDIRF Annual Meeting of Members, the meeting was adjourned at 10:12 a.m. (Ty DeWitz/ Blake Crosby, passed unanimously by voice vote.)




