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- § 1 The Contractor and Surety, jointly and severally, bind themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns to the Owner for the performance of the Construction Contract, which is incorporated herein by reference.
- § 2 If the Contractor performs the Construction Contract, the Surety and the Contractor shall have no obligation under this Bond, except when applicable to participate in a conference as provided in Section 3.
- § 3 If there is no Owner Default under the Construction Contract, the Surety's obligation under this Bond shall arise after
  - a Contractor Default. Such notice to the Contractor and the Surety that the Owner is considering declaring a Contractor Default. Such notice shall indicate whether the Owner is requesting a conference among the Owner, Contractor and Surety to discuss the Contractor's performance. If the Owner does not request a conference, the Surety may, within five (5) business days after receipt of the Owner's notice, request such a conference. If the Surety timely requests a conference, the Owner shall attend. Unless the Owner agrees otherwise, any conference requested under this Section 3.1 shall be held within ten (10) business days of the Surety's receipt of the Owner's notice. If the Owner, the Contractor and the Surety agree, the Contractor shall be allowed a reasonable time to perform the Construction Contract, but such an agreement shall not waive the Owner's right, if any, subsequently to declare a Contractor Default;
  - .2 the Owner declares a Contractor Default, terminates the Construction Contract and notifies the Surety;
  - .3 the Owner has agreed to pay the Balance of the Contract Price in accordance with the terms of the Construction Contract to the Surety or to a contractor selected to perform the Construction Contract.
- § 4 Failure on the part of the Owner to comply with the notice requirement in Section 3.1 shall not constitute a failure to comply with a condition precedent to the Surety's obligations, or release the Surety from its obligations, except to the extent the Surety demonstrates actual prejudice.
- § 5 When the Owner has satisfied the conditions of Section 3, the Surety shall promptly and at the Surety's expense take one of the following actions:
- § 5.1 Arrange for the Contractor, with the consent of the Owner, to perform and complete the Construction Contract;
- § 5.2 Undertake to perform and complete the Construction Contract itself, through its agents or independent contractors;
- § 5.3 Obtain bids or negotiated proposals from qualified contractors acceptable to the Owner for a contract for performance and completion of the Construction Contract, arrange for a contract to be prepared for execution by the Owner and a contractor selected with the Owner's concurrence, to be secured with performance and payment bonds executed by a qualified surety equivalent to the bonds issued on the Construction Contract, and pay to the Owner the amount of damages as described in Section 7 in excess of the Balance of the Contract Price incurred by the Owner as a result of the Contractor Default; or
- § 5.4 Waive its right to perform and complete, arrange for completion, or obtain a new contractor and with reasonable promptness under the circumstances:
  - .1 After investigation, determine the amount for which it may be liable to the Owner and, as soon as practicable after the amount is determined, make payment to the Owner; or
  - .2 Deny liability in whole or in part and notify the Owner, citing the reasons for denial.
- § 6 If the Surety does not proceed as provided in Section 5 with reasonable promptness, the Surety shall be deemed to be in default on this Bond seven days after receipt of an additional written notice from the Owner to the Surety demanding that the Surety perform its obligations under this Bond, and the Owner shall be entitled to enforce any remedy available to the Owner. If the Surety proceeds as provided in Section 5.4, and the Owner refuses the payment or the Surety has denied liability, in whole or in part, without further notice the Owner shall be entitled to enforce any remedy available to the Owner.

- § 7 If the Surety elects to act under Section 5.1, 5.2 or 5.3, then the responsibilities of the Surety to the Owner shall not be greater than those of the Contractor under the Construction Contract, and the responsibilities of the Owner to the Surety shall not be greater than those of the Owner under the Construction Contract. Subject to the commitment by the Owner to pay the Balance of the Contract Price, the Surety is obligated, without duplication, for
  - .1 the responsibilities of the Contractor for correction of defective work and completion of the Construction Contract;
  - .2 additional legal, design professional and delay costs resulting from the Contractor's Default, and resulting from the actions or failure to act of the Surety under Section 5; and
  - .3 liquidated damages, or if no liquidated damages are specified in the Construction Contract, actual damages caused by delayed performance or non-performance of the Contractor.
- § 8 If the Surety elects to act under Section 5.1, 5.3 or 5.4, the Surety's liability is limited to the amount of this Bond.
- § 9 The Surety shall not be liable to the Owner or others for obligations of the Contractor that are unrelated to the Construction Contract, and the Balance of the Contract Price shall not be reduced or set off on account of any such unrelated obligations. No right of action shall accrue on this Bond to any person or entity other than the Owner or its heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.
- § 10 The Surety hereby waives notice of any change, including changes of time, to the Construction Contract or to related subcontracts, purchase orders and other obligations.
- § 11 Any proceeding, legal or equitable, under this Bond may be instituted in any court of competent jurisdiction in the location in which the work or part of the work is located and shall be instituted within two years after a declaration of Contractor Default or within two years after the Contractor ceased working or within two years after the Surety refuses or fails to perform its obligations under this Bond, whichever occurs first. If the provisions of this Paragraph are void or prohibited by law, the minimum period of limitation available to sureties as a defense in the jurisdiction of the suit shall be applicable.
- § 12 Notice to the Surety, the Owner or the Contractor shall be mailed or delivered to the address shown on the page on which their signature appears.
- § 13 When this Bond has been furnished to comply with a statutory or other legal requirement in the location where the construction was to be performed, any provision in this Bond conflicting with said statutory or legal requirement shall be deemed deleted herefrom and provisions conforming to such statutory or other legal requirement shall be deemed incorporated herein. When so furnished, the intent is that this Bond shall be construed as a statutory bond and not as a common law bond.

### § 14 Definitions

- § 14.1 Balance of the Contract Price. The total amount payable by the Owner to the Contractor under the Construction Contract after all proper adjustments have been made, including allowance to the Contractor of any amounts received or to be received by the Owner in settlement of insurance or other claims for damages to which the Contractor is entitled, reduced by all valid and proper payments made to or on behalf of the Contractor under the Construction Contract.
- § 14.2 Construction Contract. The agreement between the Owner and Contractor identified on the cover page, including all Contract Documents and changes made to the agreement and the Contract Documents.
- § 14.3 Contractor Default Failure of the Contractor, which has not been remedied or waived, to perform or otherwise to comply with a material term of the Construction Contract.
- § 14.4 Owner Default. Failure of the Owner, which has not been remedied or waived, to pay the Contractor as required under the Construction Contract or to perform and complete or comply with the other material terms of the Construction Contract.
- § 14.5 Contract Documents. All the documents that comprise the agreement between the Owner and Contractor.
- § 15 If this Bond is issued for an agreement between a Contractor and subcontractor, the term Contractor in this Bond shall be deemed to be Subcontractor and the term Owner shall be deemed to be Contractor.

**AUTHORITY**: This application is being evaluated under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act for the discharge of dredged or fill material in waters of the United States.

**LOCATION**: The project would take place on the eastern shoreline of the impoundment of a tributary to Apple Creek created by McDowell Dam. The McDowell Dam Recreation Area is located east of Bismarck in Section 27, Township 139 North, Range 79 West, Latitude 46.830319° North, Longitude -100.635535° West, Burleigh County, North Dakota.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**: The applicant is proposing to stabilize between 300 and 350 linear feet of shoreline to check erosion threatening an established pedestrian trail. Approximately 418 cubic yards of material is proposed to be utilized to complete the project with about one-third or 140 cubic yards being placed below the ordinary high water mark. Budgetary constraints may reduce the totals, but the proposal represents the maximum amount likely to be discharged. The attached drawings provide additional project details.

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

**Environmental Setting**. The impoundment created by McDowell Dam covers approximately 56 acres and includes 3.2 miles of shoreline. Average water depth is 12.3 feet and maximum depth is 39.6 feet. Bluegill and largemouth bass are abundant, and North Dakota Game and Fish Department releases catchable-sized trout each spring. The McDowell Dam Recreation Area is a 271-acre, day-use-only park owned by the applicant and managed by Bismarck Parks and Recreation District. The park features a 2.45-mile nature trail encircling the water, picnic shelters, horseshoe pits, concession area, playground and restrooms. In addition, it offers water-based recreation with a large swimming beach, boat

Alternatives. Due to the trail's proximity to the property line, additional land rights would have to be obtained to move the trail away from the eroding bank. The applicant has reached out to the adjacent landowner, who is not interested in that option. No alternative stabilization designs have been provided as the consultant anticipated the project to be permitted under a nationwide permit. As stated above, cumulative impacts caused evaluation to be elevated to a standard permit. Additional information concerning project alternatives may be available from the applicant or their consultant, Houston Engineering, Bismarck. Other alternatives may develop during the review process for this permit application. All reasonable project alternatives, in particular those which may be less damaging to the aquatic environment, will be considered.

**Mitigation**. The Corps requires that applicants consider and use all reasonable and practical measures to avoid and minimize impacts to aquatic resources. If the applicant is unable to avoid or minimize all impacts, the Corps may require compensatory mitigation. No mitigation has been proposed.

**OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AUTHORIZATIONS**: Water quality certification or a waiver, as required under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act from the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality is required for this project. The applicant has submitted a pre-filing meeting request and is waiting the required 30 days until submitting the certification request.

HISTORIC PROPERTIES: The Corps preliminary determination is that the project would have No Potential to Cause Effect as all work would occur on the eroding bankline. However, the final determination will be made after receiving comments in response to this public notice. The Corps will initiate consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as appropriate.

**ENDANGERED SPECIES**: The project would not affect any Federally-listed threatened or endangered species or their critical habitat that are protected by the Endangered Species Act.

The above determinations are based on information provided by the applicant and our preliminary review.

**EVALUATION FACTORS**: The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impacts, including cumulative impacts, of the described activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefit, which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the described activity, must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the described activity will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, consideration of property ownership and, in general, the needs and welfare of

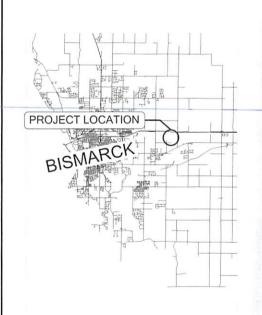

#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Board of Commissioners Burleigh County Water Resource District Bismarck, North Dakota

#### **Report on the Financial Statements**

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities and the major fund of the Burleigh County Water Resource District, Bismarck, North Dakota, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2020, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Burleigh County Water Resource District's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

#### Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Management has omitted the *management's discussion and analysis* that accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require to be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such missing information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended December 31, 2020

#### NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements of the Burleigh County Water Resource District ("District") have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) as applicable to governments. The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) is the accepted setting body for establishing governmental accounting and financial reporting principles. The more significant of the District's accounting policies are described below.

#### **Financial Reporting Entity**

The District has considered all potential component units for which the District is financially accountable and other organizations for which the nature and significance of their relationships with the District are such that exclusion would cause the District's financial statements to be misleading or incomplete. The Governmental Accounting Standards Board has set forth criteria to be considered in determining financial accountability. These criteria include appointing a voting majority of an organization's governing body and (1) the ability of the District to impose its will on that organization or (2) the potential for the organization to provide specific financial benefits to, or impose specific financial burdens on the District.

Based on these criteria, there are no component units within the Burleigh County Water Resource District as a reporting entity.

#### **Basis of Presentation**

Government-wide statements. The statement of net position and the statement of activities display information about the primary government. These statements include the financial activities of the overall government, except for fiduciary activities. Eliminations have been made to minimize the double-counting of internal activities. Governmental activities generally are financed through taxes, intergovernmental revenues, service charges, and other non-exchange transactions.

The statement of activities presents a comparison between direct expenses and program revenues for each function of the District's governmental activities. Direct expenses are those that are specifically associated with a program or function and, therefore, are clearly identifiable to a particular function. Program revenues include (a) fees and charges paid by the recipients of goods or services offered by the programs and (b) grants and contributions that are restricted to meeting the operational or capital requirements of a particular program. Revenues that are not classified as program revenues, including all taxes, interest, and non-restricted grants and contributions, are presented as general revenues.

*Fund Financial Statements.* The fund financial statements provide information about the District's fund. Separate statements are provided for the governmental fund. The emphasis of fund financial statements is on the major governmental fund.

The District reports the following major governmental fund:

General Fund: This is the District's primary operating fund. It accounts for all financial resources of the general government.

#### **Measurement Focus / Basis of Accounting**

Government-wide Financial Statements: The government-wide financial statements are reported using the economic resources measurement focus. The government-wide financial statements are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recorded when earned and expenses are recorded at the time liabilities are incurred, regardless of when the related cash flows take place. Non-exchange transactions, in which the District gives (or receives) value without directly receiving (or giving) equal value in exchange, include property taxes, grants, entitlements, and donations. On an accrual basis, revenue from property taxes is recognized in the fiscal year for which the taxes are levied. Revenue from grants, entitlements, and donations is recognized in the fiscal year in which all eligibility requirements have been satisfied.

Governmental Fund Financial Statements: The governmental fund is reported using the current financial resources measurement focus and the modified accrual basis of accounting. Under this method, revenues are recognized when measurable and available. The District considers all revenues reported in the governmental funds to be available if the revenues are collected within sixty days after year-end. All revenues are considered to be susceptible to accrual. Expenditures are recorded when the related fund liability is incurred, except for principal and interest on long-term debt, and claims and judgments, which are recognized as expenditures to the extent they have matured. Capital asset acquisitions are reported as expenditures in governmental funds. Proceeds of long-term debt and acquisitions under capital leases are reported as other financing sources.

Under the terms of grant agreements, the District funds certain programs by a combination of specific cost-reimbursement grants and general revenues. Thus, when program expenses are incurred, there is both restricted and unrestricted net position available to finance the program. It is the District's policy to first apply cost-reimbursement grant resources to such programs, and then by general revenues.

When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the District's policy to use restricted resources first, then unrestricted resources as they are needed.

#### Cash

Cash consists of amounts in demand deposits and money market accounts.

#### **Capital Assets**

Capital assets include property, plant, and equipment. Assets are reported in the governmental activities column in the government-wide financial statements. Capital assets are defined by the government as assets with an initial, individual cost of more than \$5,000. Such assets are recorded at historical cost or estimated historical cost if purchased or constructed. Donated capital assets are recorded at acquisition value at the date of donation. The costs of normal maintenance and repairs that do not add to the value of the asset or materially extend asset lives are not capitalized. Interest incurred during the construction phase of capital assets is not capitalized.

#### **Long-Term Obligations**

In the government-wide financial statements, long-term debt and other long-term obligations are reported as liabilities in the governmental activities statement of net position.

In the fund financial statements, the face amount of the debt is reported as other financing sources. When applicable, premiums received on debt issuances are reported as other financing sources while discounts on debt issuances are reported as other financing uses. Issuance costs are reported as debt service expenditures. Issuance costs are reported as debt service expenditures.

#### **Fund Balance Classifications**

It is the policy of the District to spend restricted resources first, followed by unrestricted resources. It is also the policy of the Board to spend unrestricted resources of funds in the following order: committed, assigned and then unassigned.

Restricted Fund Balances. Restricted fund balances are shown by primary function on the balance sheet. Restricted fund balances are restricted by tax levies (enabling legislation) and by outside 3rd parties (state and federal governments for various grants & reimbursements).

Committed – These amounts can only be used for specific purposes pursuant to constraints imposed by formal resolutions or ordinances of the board of commissioners-the District's highest level of decision-making authority. Those committed amounts cannot be used for any other purpose unless the board of commissioners removes the specified use by taking the same type of action imposing the commitment. This classification also includes contractual obligations to the extent that existing resources in the fund have been specifically committed for use in satisfying those contractual requirements.

Assigned – This classification reflects the amounts constrained by the District's "intent" to be used for specific purposes but are neither restricted nor committed.

*Unassigned* – This fund balance is the residual classification for the General Fund. It is also used to report negative fund balances in other governmental funds.

#### **Net Position**

When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the District's policy to use restricted resources first, then unrestricted resources as they are needed.

Net investment in capital assets is reported for capital assets less accumulated depreciation, as well as net of any related debt to purchase or finance the capital assets. These assets are not available for future spending.

Restrictions of net position in the statement of net position are due to restricted tax levies and restricted federal & state grants/reimbursements.

#### NOTE 2 PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENT

Net position of the District as of January 1, 2020 has been restated for net capital asset adjustments as shown below. The results of the adjustment increased the beginning net position of the District.

#### NOTE 3 EXCESS OF EXPENDITURES OVER APPROPRIATIONS

The District's expenditures exceeded appropriations by \$21,333 as of December 31, 2020.

#### NOTE 4 DEPOSITS

#### **Custodial Credit Risk**

Custodial credit risk is the risk associated with the failure of a depository institution, such that in the event of a depository financial institution's failure, the District would not be able to recover the deposits or collateralized securities that in the possession of the outside parties. The District does not have a formal policy regarding deposits that limits the amount it may invest in any one issuer.

In accordance with North Dakota Statutes, deposits must either be deposited with the Bank of North Dakota or in other financial institution situated and doing business within the state. Deposits, other than with the Bank of North Dakota, must be fully insured or bonded. In lieu of a bond, a financial institution may provide a pledge of securities equal to 110% of the deposits not covered by insurance or bonds.

Authorized collateral includes bills, notes, or bonds issued by the United States government, its agencies or instrumentalities, all bonds and notes guaranteed by the United States government, federal land bank bonds, bonds, notes, warrants, certificates of indebtedness, insured certificates of deposit, shares of investment companies registered under the Investment Companies Act of 1940, and all other forms of securities issued by the State of North Dakota, its boards, agencies or instrumentalities or by any county, city, township, school district, park district, or other political subdivision of the state of North Dakota. Whether payable from special revenues or supported by the full faith and credit of the issuing body and bonds issued by another state of the United States or such other securities approved by the banking board.

At year ended December 31, 2020, the District's carrying amount of deposits totaled \$2,133,447, and the bank balances totaled \$2,136,347. Of the bank balances, \$500,000 was covered by Federal Depository Insurance. The remaining bank balances were collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution's agent in the government's name.

#### NOTE 5 PROPERTY TAXES

Property taxes are levied as of January 1. The property taxes attach as an enforceable lien on property on January 1. The tax levy may be paid in two installments: the first installment includes one-half of the real estate taxes and all the special assessments; the second installment is the balance of the real estate taxes. The first installment is due by March 1 and the second installment is due by October 15. A 5% discount is allowed if all taxes and special assessments are paid by February 15. After the due dates, the bill becomes delinquent and penalties are assessed.

#### NOTE 6 RISK MANAGEMENT

The District is exposed to various risks of loss relating to torts; theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets; errors and omissions; injuries to employees; and natural disasters.

In 1986, state agencies and political subdivisions of the state of North Dakota joined together to form the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund (NDIRF), a public entity risk pool currently operating as a common risk management and insurance program for the state and over 2,000 political subdivisions. The District pays an annual premium to NDIRF for liability coverage. The coverage by NDIRF is limited to losses of \$2,000,000.

The District also participates in the North Dakota Fire and Tornado Fund and the State Bonding Fund. The District pays an annual premium to the Fire and Tornado Fund to cover property damage to buildings and personal property. Replacement cost coverage is provided by estimating replacement cost in consultation with the Fire and Tornado Fund. The Fire and Tornado Fund is reinsured by a third-party insurance carrier for losses in excess of two million dollars per occurrence during a 12-month period. The State Bonding Fund currently provides the District with blanket fidelity bond coverage in the amount of \$1,222,704 for its employees. The State Bonding Fund does not currently charge any premium for this coverage.

#### NOTE 9 TAX ABATEMENTS

Burleigh County and political subdivisions within the County can negotiate property tax abatement agreements with individuals and various commercial entities/businesses. Burleigh County and the political subdivisions within have the following types of tax abatement agreements with various individuals and commercial entities at December 31, 2020.

The District will state individually the parties whom received a benefit of the reduction in taxes of 20% or greater when compared to the total reduction of taxes for all tax abatement programs.

#### **Charitable Organization**

Under NDCC §57-02-08(8), buildings belonging to institutions of public charity, including public hospitals and nursing homes licensed pursuant to NDCC §23-16-01 under the control of religious or charitable institutions, used wholly or in part for public charity, together with the land actually occupied by such institutions not leased or otherwise used with a view to profit is exempt.

Under this program, there was a total reduction in property taxes of \$36,680, which was due to agreements with other local governments.

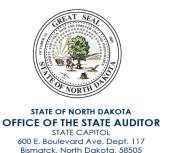

#### Independent Auditor's Report

We have audited, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of the governmental activities and the major fund of Burleigh County Water Resource District as of and for the year ended December 31, 2020, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise Burleigh County Water Resource District's basic financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated REPORT DATE.

#### **Internal Control Over Financial Reporting**

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered Burleigh County Water Resource District's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) to determine the audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Burleigh County Water Resource District's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of Burleigh County Water Resource District's internal control.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that have not been identified. However, as described in the accompanying *schedule of audit findings*, we did identify certain deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. We consider the deficiencies described in the accompanying schedule of audit findings as item 2020-001 to be a material weaknesses.

#### **Compliance and Other Matters**

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether Burleigh County Water Resource District's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

#### 2020-001 LACK OF SEGREGATION OF DUTIES - MATERIAL WEAKNESS

#### Condition

Burleigh County Water Resource District has limited personnel responsible for most accounting functions. A lack of segregation of duties exists as limited personnel are responsible to collect and deposit monies, issue checks, send checks to vendors, record receipts disbursement in journals, maintain the general ledger, create credit memos, and perform bank reconciliations.

#### Criteria

Proper internal control surrounding the custody of assets, the recording of transactions, reconciling bank accounts and preparation of financial statements dictates there should be sufficient accounting personnel, so duties of employees are properly segregated. The segregation of duties would provide better control over the assets of the WRD.

#### Cause

The Burleigh County Water Resource District has no full-time staff. They outsource their secretarial and bookkeeping duties to Personalized Management Services Inc. Personalized Management Services has limited staff which makes segregating duties difficult.

#### **Effect**

Limited segregation of duties exposes the District to risk of loss of assets, potential liabilities, and damage to the reputation, whether due to error or fraud.

#### **Prior Recommendation**

Yes.

#### Recommendation

To mitigate the risk associated with this lack of segregation of duties, we recommend the following:

- Financial statements, credit memos, and payroll registers should be reviewed, analyzed, and spot-checked by a responsible official.
- Where possible, segregate the functions of approval, posting, custody of assets, and reconciliation as they relate
  to any amounts which impact the financial statements.

#### **Burleigh County Water Resource District's Response**

Agree. The Burleigh County Water Resource District agrees and will segregate duties as it becomes feasible.

As stated in our engagement letter dated March 10, 2021, our responsibility, as described by professional standards, is to plan and perform our audit to obtain reasonable, but not absolute, assurance about whether the basic financial statements are free of material misstatement. Because of the concept of reasonable assurance and because we did not perform a detailed examination of all transactions, there is a risk that material errors, or fraud may exist and not be detected by us.

#### Significant Accounting Policies/Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. In accordance with the terms of our engagement letter, we will advise management about the appropriateness of accounting policies and their application. The significant accounting policies used by Burleigh County Water Resource District are described in Note 1 to the financial statements. Application of existing policies was not changed during the year ended December 31, 2020. We noted no transactions entered into by the governmental unit during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. There are no significant transactions that have been recognized in the financial statements in a different period than when the transaction occurred.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements presented by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimate affecting the financial statements is useful lives of capital assets.

#### **Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements**

Professional standards require us to accumulate all known and likely misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are trivial, and report them to the appropriate level of management. Management has corrected all such misstatements. The schedule below lists all misstatements detected as a result of audit procedures that were corrected by management.

# SIBLEY ISLAND FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT STATUS UPDATE MEMORANDUM

Work on the Sibley Island Flood Control Project Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) has been on hold due to the pending establishment of a break-out floodway on Apple Creek. This floodway is being defined as part of an updated Burleigh County Flood Insurance Study and FEMA Risk Map Program. This new floodway affects a number of residences in the Apple Creek floodplain and crosses the originally proposed alignment for the Sibley Island Flood Control Project. Subsequently, new revised alignments were evaluated for viability and cost. The revised floodway mapping is not included in this memorandum.

While two new alignments were considered, it was recognized that there are properties that were within the originally intended protection area that would no longer be protected. These landowners will be notified during the next project public informational meeting. The three alignments considered in the PER are illustrated on *Figure One. Alternative One* is the original alignment, which is no longer viable due to the floodway designation. *Alternative Two* is a township roadway alignment suggested by the Burleigh County Highway Department (BCHD). *Alternative Three* is a natural high ground alignment that provides a lower cost project that also protects properties that the township roadway alignment does not.

Preliminary Opinions of Probable Cost (OPC) were developed for each alternative but are not presented here, as there are multiple factors still under consideration. The least expensive alignment with considerable savings is *Alternative Three*. This alternative requires the use of only small segments of township roadway on South 12<sup>th</sup> Street and Sibley Drive, as well as acquisition of an easement or ownership across private property. We will still need to contact with the landowner to open discussions regarding the option for this location.

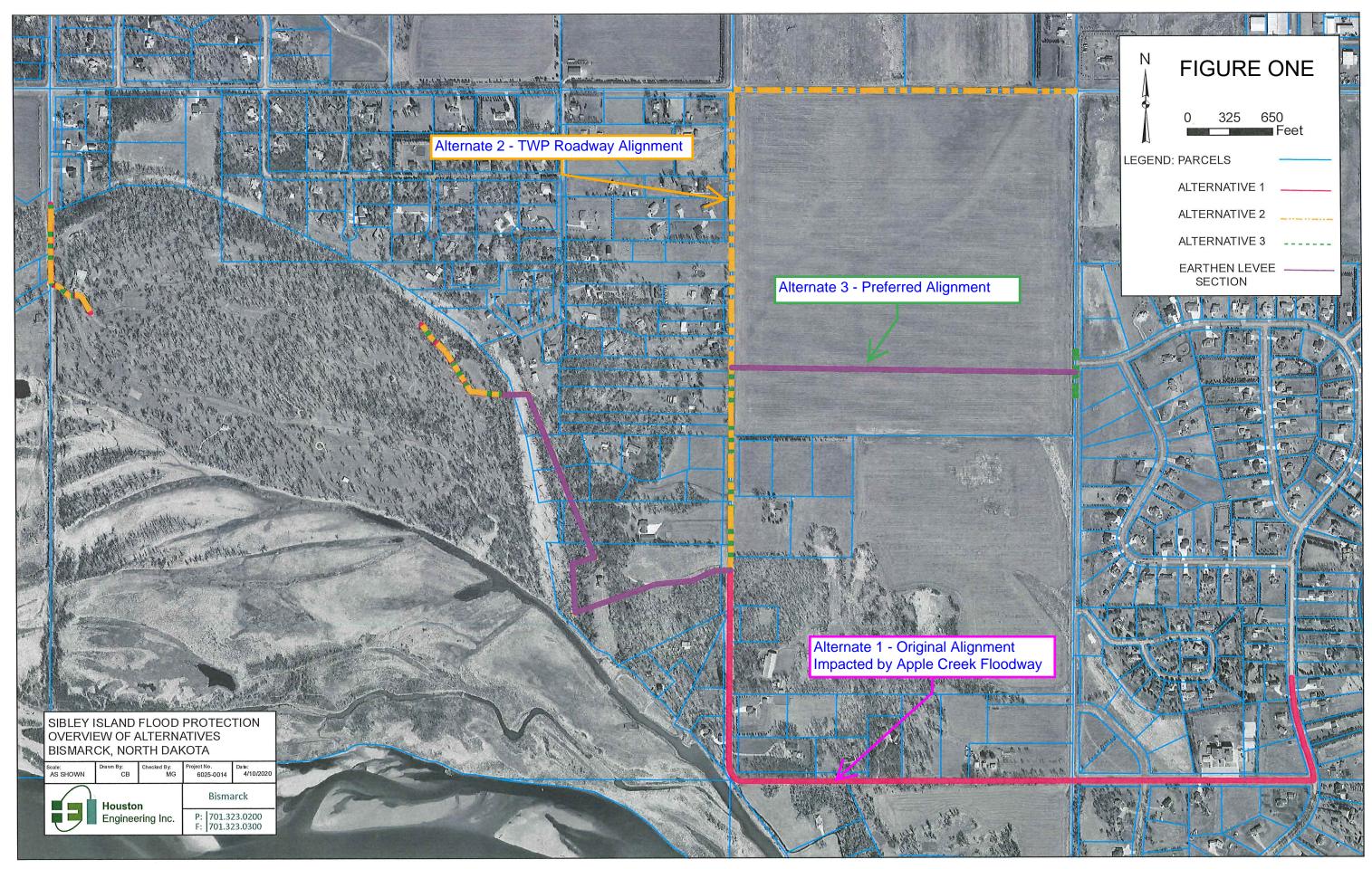
As the project costs are being considered, one element to resolve is the special assessment district boundary. The Burleigh County Highway Department initially committed to contributing to the township roadway grade raises, however under *Alternative Three* those grade raises are now limited. Subsequently, their level of participation is likely to be reconsidered. In addition, the PER budget initially assigned to the BCHD consultant to revise the grade raise options is now required to complete the additional design services by the Burleigh County WRD. This includes additional geotechnical exploration on the preferred alignment.

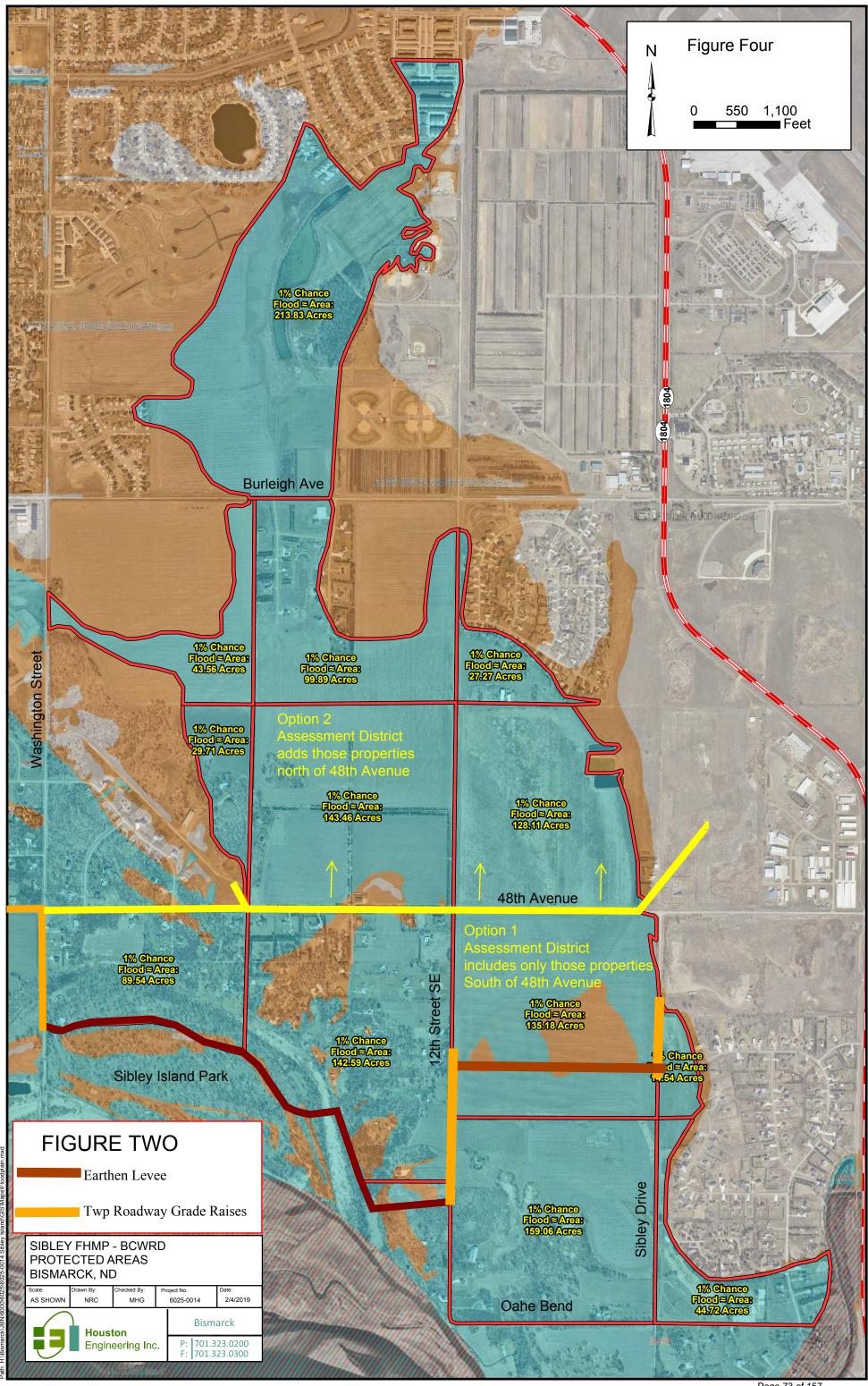
Two potential special assessment district boundaries are under consideration to fund the project. **Option One** is based on the original northern boundary at 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue SE, using the revised southern limit created via the *Alternative Three* alignment. The 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue SE boundary was the line of protection established during the 2011 flood event. The BCHD agreed in principle to pay for the township grade raises as they facilitated the 2011 protection level, therefore properties north of this line would not be included in the special assessment district. **Option Two** would assess all properties protected by the Sibley Island Flood Control Project, including those north of 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue SE. The exception being those parcels already located within the Missouri River Correctional Center's special assessment district. These two districts are illustrated on **Figure Two**.

The work on the PER continues along the lines noted above. Project information will be transmitted to the USACE related to the geotechnical exploration, river hydraulic evaluation, hydrology update and a request for SHIPO review, for the Sibley Island Flood Control Project.

This letter transmits to the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) the following documents, as part of the overall Section 408 permit compliance process for the Sibley Island Flood Control Project (Project), which is partially located on USACE property. This information will also be included as an appendix to the Preliminary Engineering Report.

- 1. Geotechnical Evaluation Braun Intertec date ☐

The geotechnical evaluation was completed under an approved USACE permit, to evaluate the soils in the location of a proposed earthen levee. This primarily focused on an existing earthen embankment across the old river oxbow east of the Sibley Island Park. This embankment is located partly on USACE property and partially on private property. The exploration results are included in the enclosed report prepared by Braun Intertec. This report provides data that will be used to design the flood control levee through this area. Additional soils exploration will likely be required during final design.

The hydraulic impacts associated with Project implemenation were evaluated using the effective Flood Insurance (FIS) HEC-RAS Model, as noted in the attached Hydraulic Impacts Report. The findings and conclusions indicate there are no measurable issues related to changes in water surface elevations associated with the Project. Therefore, there are also no adverse impacts to other federally constructed projects, (e.g., the Lower Heart River Flood Control Project, Mandan, North Dakota).

During an initial meeting, the USACE questioned if there were any recent updates to the Missouri River hydrology in this reach. The North Dakota State Water Commission, working with FEMA, is presently updating the flood insurance rate maps for Burleigh County. As part of that process, the Missouri River hydrology was extensively evaluated and updated. The new flow frequencies are provided in the enclosed report that has undergone FEMA review.

The Burleigh County Water Resource District is continuing to evaluate project alternatives and will be completing a Preliminary Engineering Report, after which a public information hearing will be held. It is anticipated, as part of the Section 408 (e.g., NEPA) process, the various agencies will be notified and invited to attend this meeting. A later public hearing will be held with those to be included in the special assessment district whose properties are protected and benefited from Project construction.



The Burleigh County Water Resource District recently sent the enclosed request to SHPO for a preliminary review of the proposed alignments regarding Section 106 clearance. If there is anything documented in this review, more in-depth investigation would be required as part of final design.

# <u>Application to Install a Subsurface Water Management System No. 2021-01 for</u> John T. Farmer in the Northwest Ouarter of Section 33 in Tillable Township

The Board next reviewed an Application to Install a Subsurface Water Management System No. 2021-01 dated June 1, 2021, filed with the Board by Applicant John T. Farmer on June 4, 2021. Further, Applicant was required to submit a complete Application, including a completed and signed State permit Application; County tax roll evidence regarding ownership of the property Applicant intends to tile; a detailed project design map (an exempt record under North Dakota law); a detailed downstream flow map; and County tax roll evidence regarding property ownership up to one mile downstream of each project outlet, or up to the nearest assessment drain, natural watercourse, slough, or lake, whichever comes first. The Board's staff confirmed the Application was complete on June 8, 2021 [SMF Note: WRDs must notify Applicants if an Application is incomplete "within three business days after the day the [WRD] receives the Application"; if an Application is incomplete, but the WRD fails to notify the Applicant within three business days, the Application is legally "complete" regardless of what may be missing]. By law, Applicant was required to submit the Board's permit fee (the Board will refund any dollars not used for purposes of processing the Application) before the Board may approve the Application; the Board confirmed Applicant submitted the fee. Since Applicant submitted all required items, the Board may consider and approve the Application. [SMF Note: WRDs must consider and approve all "complete" Applications within 30 days of the date of filing; if a WRD fails to approve an Application within 30 days, the Application is automatically approved without any conditions.]

Under the Application, Applicant seeks to install a 160-acre drain tile system in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 in Tillable Township, Corn County, North Dakota. The project will include a single pump outlet located on the west boundary of the Northwest Quarter; the pump will discharge into the east road ditch along 10th Avenue SE; the discharge will travel south in the east road ditch, along the west boundary of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 33; at the southwest corner of the Northwest Quarter of Section 33, the discharge will flow east and south, under 10th Avenue, to the northeast corner of the Southeast Quarter of Section 32; from there, the discharge will flow south in the west road ditch along 10th Avenue, along the east boundary of the Southeast Ouarter of Section 32; at the southeast corner of the Southeast Quarter, the discharge will flow into the north road ditch along the County Line Road/2nd Street SE and will flow west along the south boundary of the Southeast Ouarter of Section 32. [SMF Note: Detailed flow descriptions, in addition to accurate downstream flow maps from Applicants, are important for WRDs to protect themselves, as well as Applicants and their projects; if another party were to file a drainage complaint against a project years later, a detailed flow description in the minutes and Notice of Decision will allow a WRD to easily determine if the Applicant installed the system approved by the WRD, in which case the WRD could easily dismiss the drainage complaint.]

According to the County tax roll information supplied by Applicant, John and Elaine Farmer own the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 in Tillable Township. With regard to downstream properties, Ted and Linda Neighbor own the Southeast Quarter of Section 32. The tax rolls do not indicate if the County owns its highway right of way or if the County relies on the statutory 33-foot easement.

Manager Johnson moved, and Manager Smith seconded the motion, to approve *Application to Install a Subsurface Water Management System No. 2021-01* dated June 1, 2021, for John T. Farmer in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 in Tillable Township, and to authorize the Secretary-Treasurer to sign Subsurface Water Management Permit No. 2021-01, subject to the following conditions:

[SMF Note: The following conditions are the only conditions WRDs can attach to permits under Section 61-32-03.1(4); do no attach all of them to each permit! Only attach those that apply and be certain your WRD has a valid rationale for each condition.]

- 1) that Applicant set and install any drain tile pump at least 25 feet from the top of the back slope of Corn County Drain #1, with a pipe buried from the pump to Drain #1;
- 2) that Applicant install and maintain erosion protection at any and all outlets into Corn County Drain #1;
- 3) that Applicant install and maintain erosion protection or other ditch stabilization materials at any and all outlets into Tillable Township's road right of way/Corn County's highway right of way/NDDOT's highway right of way;
- 4) that Applicant install and maintain erosion protection at any and all outlets into Soybean Lake/Soybean Slough/Soybean River/the natural watercourse in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33;
- 5) that Applicant re-establish any areas disturbed installing or maintaining Applicant's tile system, including re-seeding any Corn County Drain #1 right of way disturbed;
- 6) that Applicant will not install Applicant's tile system within 20 feet, on either side, of any rural water lines Corn Rural Water District has in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 in Tillable Township under any blanket easements, or otherwise beyond the Water District's existing easement;
- 7) that Applicant must turn off any pump outlets and otherwise close all outlets during "critical flood periods," as determined by the Corn County Water Resource District:

- 8) that Applicant must install and maintain a control structure at the gravity outlet, and must close the outlet during "critical flood periods," as determined by the Corn County Water Resource District [SMF Note: WRDs should utilize and attach this condition sparingly, and only if an investigation prior to permit approval reveals the gravity outlet could somehow damage property or infrastructure; include detailed discussion in the minutes regarding the investigation and potential damages];
- 9) that Applicant must apply for an amendment to SUBSURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT PERMIT No. 2021-01 in advance of any proposed alterations to outlet locations, the addition of any outlets, or improvements or modifications to the tile system that could increase the capacity or drainage area of the tile system;
- 10) [SMF Note: If the project will introduce new drainage into the watershed area of an assessment drain, and only if the tiled property is not already in the assessment district for that particular drain, this condition allows a WRD to add the parcel to the assessment district without conducting a lengthy and expensive reassessment process] that the Board will include the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 of Tillable Township in the Corn County Drain #1 assessment district at 50% benefit [SMF Note: WRDs must conduct detailed analyses of the benefits tiled property will receive from a legal assessment drain, and include all relevant analysis and materials in and attached to your minutes]; and
- 11) that Applicant remove silt or vegetation, or repair erosion or scour damages *directly* caused by Applicant's tile system, but only up to one mile downstream from **[describe specific outlet, if more than one]** the project outlet **OR** but only up to the discharge into Corn County Drain #1 **OR** but only up to the discharge into Soybean Lake/Soybean Slough/Soybean River/the natural watercourse in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33.

Upon roll call vote, the motion carried unanimously.

With regard to condition #11, Applicant's obligations to remove silt or vegetation, or to repair erosion or scour damages, will only arise upon submission of substantial evidence to the Board by a downstream landowner or road authority that Applicant's tile system *directly* caused accumulation of silt or vegetation, erosion, or scouring. [SMF Note: HB 1437 is clear that condition #11 above places the burden of proof on the complaining party, and that party must submit "substantial evidence" that the tile system "directly" caused the silt or cattail growth, erosion, or scouring; a downstream party simply submitting a complaint is not "substantial evidence." If a downstream party or road authority submits "substantial evidence" the project "directly" caused damages, the WRD may consider conducting some type of hearing, or at least inviting all parties to a meeting to discuss the matter, before enforcing this condition. The Board should then issue a written notice to all parties regarding the Board's final decision.]

Under Section 61-32-03.1, the District cannot attach any additional conditions to Applicant's permit. However, for Applicant's protection, and to ensure protection of Applicant's tile system, the District will recommend that Applicant consider complying with the following:

- 1) that Applicant obtain easements from the owners of the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 [if not owned by Applicant] to install, construct, and maintain Applicant's tile system;
- 2) that Applicant obtain a pipeline easement from the owners the Southwest Quarter of Section 33 to install, construct, and maintain a buried pipeline;
- 3) that Applicant obtain written permission from the Tillable Township Board of Township Supervisors/Corn County Highway Department/NDDOT to discharge into, or otherwise utilize, any of its township road/highway ditches; to install, operate, and maintain buried pipe in any of its township road/highway ditches; or to bore through its township road/highway; and
- 4) that Applicant obtain all other necessary and requisite licenses, permits, registrations, and/or approvals from all applicable federal, state, county, and municipal governments, and any other applicable governmental entities.

The Board will provide copies of the Board's NOTICE OF DECISION, SUBSURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT PERMIT NO. 2021-01, and Applicant's downstream flow map to the State Engineer's Office, Ted and Linda Neighbor, NDDOT, Corn Rural Water District, and the Corn County Highway Department; the Board will send the parties copies by first-class mail, attested by an affidavit of mailing, all as required under Section 61-32-03.1(6). Applicant's detailed project design map is an exempt record, and the Board will not provide copies to any third parties.

### CORN COUNTY WATER RESOURCE DISTRICT RESOLUTION OF POLICY REGARDING TILE DRAINAGE APPLICATION FEES

WHEREAS, the Corn County Water Resource District (the "District") is a North Dakota water resource district and political subdivision under Chapters 61-16 and 61-16.1 of the North Dakota Century Code.

WHEREAS, the District supports tile drainage as a method of maximizing production potential for ag producers in Corn County.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 61-32-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, the District must process, consider, investigate, and approve each tile drainage application submitted to the District, also known as an "APPLICATION TO INSTALL A SUBSURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM," under Section 61-32-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code.

WHEREAS, tile permit applications require the District to conduct certain reviews and investigations before the District can make final decisions, including determinations of land ownership, potential impacts of the system to legal drains or other infrastructure, and other considerations, all in accordance with Section 61-32-03.1.

WHEREAS, the tile application review criteria are technical and legal in nature, and require compliance with specific legal procedures that typically require the District to confer with engineering and legal consultants to ensure proper review and consideration.

WHEREAS, the District's general fund budget is comprised of those dollars generated by a maximum mill levy, as limited by applicable North Dakota law, and the District must utilize its general fund to finance and fund all of its operations, with the exception of assessment projects.

WHEREAS, the District must pay for the costs required to properly consider, investigate, and process all surface and subsurface drainage permit applications with the District's limited general fund dollars, and utilizing general fund dollars for processing permits severely limits the District's ability to construct, operate, maintain, and improve other projects and water infrastructure that could benefit all residents of Corn County.

WHEREAS, in light of the financial burden on the District's general fund as a result of the District's obligation to review, consider, investigate, and process all tile drainage permit applications in Corn County in accordance with North Dakota law, the District has concluded adoption of a formal policy regarding the expenses associated with all tile drainage applications is necessary.

WHEREAS, during the 2021 Legislative Session, the North Dakota Legislature enacted HB 1437 to amend Section 61-32-03.1, and to modify the tile permitting process; one of the provisions of HB 1437 affords the District the ability to charge tile permit fees up to a maximum of \$500 per application.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this RESOLUTION OF POLICY represents the District's official policy regarding tile permit application fees for purposes of reviewing, considering, investigating, and processing all tile drainage permit applications submitted to the District under Section 61-32-03.1.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the District will comply with its obligations to properly review, consider, investigate, and process all tile drainage permit applications in accordance with Section 61-32-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code to ensure orderly and legal tile drainage in Corn County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in an effort to maintain sufficient dollars in its general fund to construct, operate, maintain, and improve other projects and water infrastructure for the benefit of all residents of Corn County, implementation and administration of a tile drainage permit fee policy is necessary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, from the date of the District's approval of this RESOLUTION, the District's permit fee for each APPLICATION TO INSTALL A SUBSURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM is \$500 per application, due at the time the District receives the application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the District's costs incurred in the course of considering, investigating, and processing any application are less than the \$500 permit fee, the District will refund the remaining funds to the applicant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this RESOLUTION OF POLICY supersedes any of the District's previous policies or practices regarding tile permit fees.

### Greetings:

This letter is to inform you of the Corn County Water Resource District's (the "District") decision regarding APPLICATION TO INSTALL A SUBSURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM No. 2021-01 dated June 1, 2021. Under the Application, Applicant seeks to install a 160-acre drain tile system in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 in Tillable Township, Corn County, North Dakota. The project will include a single pump outlet located on the west boundary of the Northwest Quarter; the pump will discharge into the east road ditch along 10th Avenue SE; the discharge will travel south in the east road ditch, along the west boundary of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 33; at the southwest corner of the Northwest Quarter of Section 33, the discharge will flow east and south, under 10th Avenue, to the northeast corner of the Southeast Quarter of Section 32; from there, the discharge will flow south in the west road ditch along 10th Avenue, along the east boundary of the Southeast Quarter of Section 32; at the southeast corner of the Southeast Quarter, the discharge will flow into the north road ditch along the County Line Road/2nd Street SE and will flow west along the south boundary of the Southeast Quarter of Section 32.

According to the County tax roll information supplied by Applicant, John and Elaine Farmer own the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 in Tillable Township. With regard to downstream properties, Ted and Linda Neighbor own the Southeast Quarter of Section 32. The tax rolls do not indicate if the County owns its highway right of way or if the County relies on the statutory 33-foot easement.

At its meeting on June 20, 2021, the District approved APPLICATION TO INSTALL A SUBSURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM No. 2021-01, dated June 1, 2021, and approved SUBSURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT PERMIT No. 2021-01, regarding a proposed tile system in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 in Tillable Township, subject to the following conditions:

- 1) that Applicant set and install any drain tile pump at least 25 feet from the top of the back slope of Corn County Drain #1, with a pipe buried from the pump to Drain #1;
- 2) that Applicant install and maintain erosion protection at any and all outlets into Corn County Drain #1;
- 3) that Applicant install and maintain erosion protection or other ditch stabilization materials at any and all outlets into Tillable Township's road right of way/Corn County's highway right of way/NDDOT's highway right of way;
- 4) that Applicant install and maintain erosion protection at any and all outlets into Soybean Lake/Soybean Slough/Soybean River/the natural watercourse in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33;
- 5) that Applicant re-establish any areas disturbed installing or maintaining Applicant's tile system, including re-seeding any Corn County Drain #1 right of way disturbed;
- 6) that Applicant will not install Applicant's tile system within 20 feet, on either side, of any rural water lines Corn Rural Water District has in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 in Tillable Township under any blanket easements, or otherwise beyond the Water District's existing easement;
- 7) that Applicant must turn off any pump outlets and otherwise close all outlets during "critical flood periods," as determined by the Corn County Water Resource District;
- 8) that Applicant must install and maintain a control structure at the gravity outlet, and must close the outlet during "critical flood periods," as determined by the Corn County Water Resource District;
- 9) that Applicant must apply for an amendment to SUBSURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT PERMIT No. 2021-01 in advance of any proposed alterations to outlet locations, the addition of any outlets, or improvements or modifications to the tile system that could increase the capacity or drainage area of the tile system;

- 10) that the Board will include the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 of Tillable Township in the Corn County Drain #1 assessment district at 50% benefit; and
- 11) that Applicant remove silt or vegetation, or repair erosion or scour damages *directly* caused by Applicant's tile system, but only up to one mile downstream from **[describe specific outlet, if more than one]** the project outlet **OR** but only up to the discharge into Corn County Drain #1 **OR** but only up to the discharge into Soybean Lake/Soybean Slough/Soybean River/the natural watercourse in the Northwest Quarter of Section 33.

Your permit will not become effective until you satisfy the conditions identified in this NOTICE OF DECISION. Further, please note that if, at any time, you fail to comply with the conditions above, your permit will no longer be valid.

With regard to condition #11, Applicant's obligations to remove silt or vegetation, or to repair erosion or scour damages, will only arise upon submission of substantial evidence to the Corn County Water Resource District by a downstream landowner or road authority that Applicant's tile system *directly* caused accumulation of silt or vegetation, erosion, or scouring.

Under Section 61-32-03.1, the District cannot attach any additional conditions to Applicant's permit. However, for Applicant's protection, and to ensure protection of Applicant's tile system, the District recommends that Applicant consider complying with the following:

- 1) that Applicant obtain easements from the owners of the Northwest Quarter of Section 33 to install, construct, and maintain Applicant's tile system;
- 2) that Applicant obtain a pipeline easement from the owners the Southwest Quarter of Section 33 to install, construct, and maintain a buried pipeline;
- 3) that Applicant obtain written permission from the Tillable Township Board of Township Supervisors/Corn County Highway Department/NDDOT to discharge into, or otherwise utilize, any of its township road/highway ditches; to install, operate, and maintain buried pipe in any of its township road/highway ditches; or to bore through its township road/highway; and
- 4) that Applicant obtain all other necessary and requisite licenses, permits, registrations, and/or approvals from all applicable federal, state, county, and municipal governments, and any other applicable governmental entities.

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING AN AUTHORIZATION TO CONSTRUCT A PROJECT WITHIN SOVEREIGN LANDS OF NORTH DAKOTA UNDER NORTH DAKOTA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE § 89-10-01-04

A person seeking to construct a project within Sovereign Lands of North Dakota requires authorization from the State Engineer before construction or operation of the project. "Sovereign Lands" means those areas, including the beds and islands, lying within the ordinary high water mark of navigable lake and streams.\(^1\) (N.D.C.C. \(^3\) 61-33-01). The "ordinary high water mark" is that line on navigable waters below which the action of the water prevents the growth of vegetation, or to restrict its growth to predominantly wetland species.

To be complete, the application must include all information listed below:

- 1. A completed "Application to Construct a Project within Sovereign Lands of North Dakota" form.
- 2. A detailed map or drawing of the projects location on an aerial photo.
  - i. Size of map must be 8 ½ by 11 inches,
  - ii. Map shall have a north arrow and approximate scale, and
  - iii. Map shall indicate the proposed work on the drawing.
- 3. If applying for the installation of a standard dock in which the total length of the dock over the surface of the water does exceed twenty-five feet on a river and fifty feet on a lake, please include measurements requested on "Supplemental Measurements Sheet for Standard Docks".
- 4. If applying for the installation of a standard dock in which the total length of the dock over the surface of the water does not exceed twenty-five feet AND is located on the Missouri River between the Oliver and Morton County line and Lake Oahe wildlife management area, the project only requires registration with the State Engineer. Please complete the "Registration for Placement of a Dock Under 25 Feet-Long on Specified Waters" form (SFN 61441).
- 5. If applying for the installation or modification (including change in transported liquid) of a pipeline which transports crude oil, natural gas liquids, or any other hazardous liquid, as determined by the State Engineer, the Applicant must first conduct a scour analysis specific to the proposed crossing for project design purposes.<sup>2</sup>
- 6. If applying for the installation of riprap or other bank stabilizations, please include a cross sectional drawing of the proposed work which includes the existing and proposed grade and the present location of the water surface.

# Further Sovereign Land Permit Guidance:

- 1. A permit would be required if any portion of the project would occur within, under, or over a navigable water of North Dakota.
- 2. A permit would be required if any portion of the project would occur below the ordinary high water mark.
- 3. The permit applicant is responsible for obtaining any other local, state, or federal permits or permissions that may be necessary prior to construction of a project on Sovereign Land.
- 4. There is no fee administered for a Sovereign Land Permit.
- 5. Please allow at least 90 days for Sovereign Land Permit processing.
- 6. Please notify the Office of the State Engineer of project completion at sovereignlands@nd.gov.
- 7. Unless specified, there is no expiration date on an obtained Sovereign Land Permit.

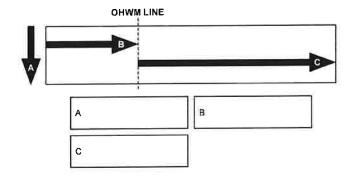

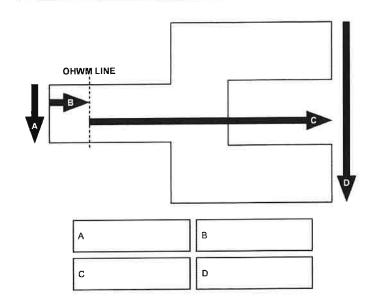

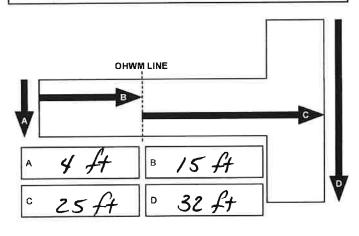

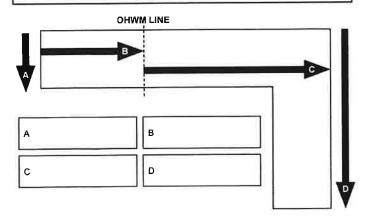

- 3. The dock is used only for embarkation, debarkation, moorage of boats, water intakes, or recreation;
- 4. The is no unreasonable interference with navigation or access to an adjacent riparian land owners property,
- 5. The dock is connected to a point above the ordinary high watermark by a boardwalk that does not exceed twenty-five (7.6 meters) in length, and is removed from below the ordinary high watermark each fall, and
- 6. Upon abandonment, the grantee restores the bank as closely as practicable to its original condition.

Mr. Stacy Tschider, Bismarck, North Dakota (Applicant) filed a Sovereign Land Permit Application with the State Engineer to place a private boat dock proximate to his riparian lot on the Missouri River (Project). The Project would be located in the SE 1/4 of Section 33, Township 140 North, Range 81 West, Burleigh County.

The Project would involve the annual placement of a floating T-shaped steel boat dock on the left bank of the Missouri River. The dock would be 4 feet wide, 25 feet long with a 32-foot long "T," and a 15-foot gang plank. The dock would be anchored above the ordinary high water mark of the Missouri River and removed from the river each fall before ice-up.

Projects which lie either partially or wholly below the ordinary high watermark of navigable streams or waters may require authorization from the State Engineer prior to construction or operation. At the discretion of the State Engineer, a public meeting may be held on the project for the purpose of gathering information. The State Engineer will consider riparian owner's rights, recreation, navigation, aesthetics, erosion, wildlife, water quality, maintenance of existing water flows, alternative uses, and the environment in determining whether to grant the authorization.

To ensure that all environmental, economic and social factors are considered in the evaluation of this application, your views and comments are solicited. It is requested that any comments or information be forwarded within 30 days of the date of this mailing to the State Engineer, at 900 East Boulevard Avenue, Bismarck, North Dakota. If no reply is received within the 30 days, it will be assumed that your agency has no comment on this project.

#### TO BURLEIGH COUNTY TAX ENTITIES:

In 2017 the North Dakota Legislature made significant changes to budget deadlines and notice requirements for all local governments. **ALL local governments** are required to file a preliminary budget with the County Auditor's Office **by August 10**<sup>th</sup>. This includes county, city, park district, school district, township, fire, ambulance, and soil conservation districts. The reason for the new deadline is to allow the county time to prepare and mail an *Estimated Tax Statement* by August 31<sup>st</sup>.

If you fail to submit a preliminary budget by August 10<sup>th</sup>, you will be limited to levying the same dollars as levied in the previous year.

If your tax levy is **less than** \$100,000, you need to publish the notice of your budget hearing in your official newspaper. If your tax levy is **greater than** \$100,000\*\*\*, you must conduct a budget hearing and provide to the Auditor's Office, the date, time, and location of your budget hearing. The budget hearing date cannot be any earlier than September 7<sup>th</sup>, nor later than October 7<sup>th</sup>.

\*\*\*Apple Creek, Gibbs, Hay Creek, Burnt Creek, and Lincoln Townships

Cities, City Park Districts, School Districts, Fire Districts, and Soil Conservation: Once you have held your final budget hearing and your board has approved the 2021 budget, you must file your final budget with the county auditor no later than October 10<sup>th</sup>. Remember the tax levy for the final budget cannot be greater than your preliminary budget. If no budget is submitted, you will not receive tax levy dollars.

#### Dates to remember:

- August 10 Deadline for submitting your preliminary budget to the county auditor if you
  don't file a preliminary budget with the county auditor by that date, you will be limited in the
  amount of your levy to what was levied in the previous year.
- August 10 Deadline for providing the date, time, and place of your final budget hearing to the county auditor.
- August 31 Deadline for county auditor to send out the estimated tax statements
- September 7 First date to hold final budget hearing if you will levy over \$100,000 in taxes
- October 7 Last date to hold final budget hearing if you will levy over \$100,000 in taxes.
- October 10 Last date to approve and file final budget with county auditor.

Greetings,

Your North Dakota Fire and Tornado Fund (NDFT) renewal for the July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022, policy year will be processed in the coming weeks. Here is an update regarding the NDIRF's administration of the NDFT and the changes that will occur upon renewal.

When the NDIRF began administering the NDFT in 2019, we committed to a three-year plan to improve NDFT operations and enhance coverage and service. We are happy to report that two years into this transition, we are ahead of schedule.

Here are some highlights to illustrate that success:

- Nearly all NDFT political subdivision members have partnered with a local agent for service of their NDFT policy, allowing for local expertise to enhance their NDFT experience.
- Administrative expenses for the NDFT have been cut by over \$200,000 per year as a result of the NDIRF's efficient operation of the Fund.
- NDIRF staff and local agents have worked with NDFT members to increase coverage limits or add structures not previously covered. Through May 1, 2021, the NDFT total insured value has grown by over \$2 billion, saving NDFT members and North Dakota taxpayers from catastrophic out-of-pocket losses due to inadequate coverage limits or uncovered property.
- The NDFT coverage for the upcoming 2021-2022 coverage period has been enhanced
  to include an option for a per occurrence deductible for wind and hail claims, rather than
  a per building deductible for wind and hail claims, increased coverage for water and
  sewer backup, improved equipment breakdown coverage, and an option to purchase
  additional debris removal coverage. To obtain more information about these

While there are many successes involving the NDFT over the past couple of years, the NDFT is also facing a significant challenge.

The NDFT purchases reinsurance to protect it from catastrophic financial losses. Unfortunately, the national property reinsurance marketplace has reduced coverage and increased pricing significantly over the past three years. In 2018, the NDFT paid approximately \$2.9 million per year for a reinsurance policy that provided coverage for losses exceeding \$1 million. Incredibly, the NDFT now pays over \$3.9 million per year for a reinsurance policy that provides coverage for losses exceeding \$2 million. In summary, the NDFT pays over \$1 million more per year for less coverage than in 2018.

Due to the dramatic increase in reinsurance costs, the NDIRF has recommended a 14% NDFT rate increase. The North Dakota Insurance Department agreed to the increase. Therefore, your entity's NDFT renewal pricing will increase by approximately 14% for the July 1, 2021, renewal.

This rate increase is due to rising reinsurance costs. NDIRF staff are constantly reevaluating ways to reduce administrative and reinsurance expenses, and we will continue that process moving forward in an attempt to soften any future changes to the national reinsurance marketplace.

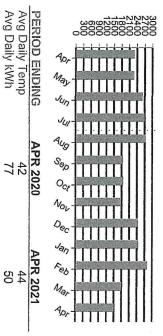

- ➤ The Apple Creek flood insurance mapping impacted project alignment along the Township roadways and the properties within the special assessment district. The draft preliminary floodplain/floodway maps were provided to community officials for review. The 60-day comment period to FEMA/NDSWC has expired. A separate public informational meeting is recommended to provide the revised mapping information to the residents in this area.
- The project realignment has resulted in increased costs to complete the preliminary design and engineering report, as the previously anticipated township roadway work has been reduced by the preferred alternative using an earthen levee option. This shifts the scope of services from the BCHD to the BCWRD for the revised design features. Therefore, the BCWRD budget will needs to increase to accommodate that change. These costs may be offset in part by eliminating the Apple Creek modeling, but the extent remains undetermined. This does not influence the State Water Commission Cost Share submittal only who pays for these services.
- Revisiting the scope of services is required to set the next step in the design process.

Subject: Fox Island Seeding Observations and

Recommendations

We have conducted a review of the grass cover on the Fox Island Flood Control Project. While visiting the site we reviewed areas that had been previously identified as problem areas to see whether the problem still existed, how well the grass is coming in, and what areas are still in need of attention. During the review, we specifically noted three areas of interest and after some discussion of our observations and possible remedies, we agreed on the following recommendations.

The first area of note was at approximately Station 10+00 to 10+50 on the Boutrous property located at 3420 Gallatin Drive. The roadside and ditch at this location was noted to have significant weed growth. It is recommended that we spray for weeds at this location and then water to aid grass growth as once the weeds are gone, the grass will be very thin.

The second and third locations are adjacent to each other and have the same recommendation. At the west and east inside bends of the intersection of Gallatin Drive and Far West Drive at Station 32+50. At the Mark Knoll property at 3309 Gallatin Drive and the Quintin Fender property at 2100 Far West Drive it was observed that the soil was very poor with very weak grass growth. The recommendation at these two locations is to bring in some topsoil and spread approximately two inches on the road sideslope to supplement the existing topsoil and then reseed these areas. I estimate that approximately 20 to 25 cubic yards should be sufficient to cover both of these areas with two inches of topsoil. If the effort is being done, more may be brought in to ensure that adequate quantity is available. Once that is completed, the landowner will be requested to water the areas to aid in establishment of grass.

We recommend contacting the respective landowners to inform them of our intended work, confirm their desire to have the work performed and to inform them that that after the work is done, they would be asked to water the affected areas to support the growth of the new grass. Proper maintenance and watering will significantly improve the results. But, if the landowner does not maintain these areas, then there may not be sufficient benefit to justify the work. The landowner would be notified that if they are willing to contribute sufficient maintenance to establish the grass, that the BCWRD is willing to contribute the work recommended herein.
