Dear Mr. Jensen:

The Burleigh County Water Resource District (District) received your complaint against Mr. Leo Bitz for installing a field approach on the north side of the Highway #10 ROW, which you are concerned could adversely impact your residence. This new approach is located west of your residence and downstream from the Brookfield Estates Floodway Channel, which is managed by the District.

The approach was evaluated based on a location survey and a determination of its capacity to convey flows generated by the Brookfield Estates Flood Control Project and the upstream watershed, see attached exhibit. Based on the evaluation this crossing will not result in additional backwaters at your residence. The 36" RCP has an upstream invert of elevation 1714.5, with a capacity to convey around 75 cfs before overtopping north through the cropland at around elevation 1716.5 to 1717.0. The north edge of Hwy 10 is at elevation 1718.8, while the ground at the south end of your lot is around elevation 1720, nearly three above the field overflow and 1.2 feet above the highway at the approach. The ground elevation near your residence, based on the topography is above 1721.

The County noted that this or a similar location is master planned for a roadway to the north should that land be developed. At that time a further review of this or a relocated crossing would be completed. Until then there is some risk for erosion in the field during larger flood events, which should be monitored, if they occur, to determine if any protective measures are necessary. This crossing complies with the North Dakota Stream Crossing Standards, using flows from USGS Regression Equations.

Therefore, the District has determined this approach does <u>NOT</u> present an obstruction to the flows and at their November 13, 2019 meeting dismissed your complaint. Given the complaint was dismissed we did not notify Mr. Bitz regarding your inquiry.

As for the issue regarding snow removal within the highway ROW that is outside our project jurisdiction, however the County Highway Department has been notified of your concern.

One more item I request be added to the BCWRD meeting agenda next week:

Rod and I recently attended a meeting with the NDSWC and HEI regarding remapping the Hay Creek Floodplain. Also in attendance were representatives from the City of Bismarck, Burleigh County Highway Dept and Burleigh County Planning.

The issue before the BCWRD, City and County is the establishment of the Floodway limits for Hay Creek.

The BCWRD in Partnership with the City of Bismarck and Bismarck Parks and Recreation District created the Hay Creek Greenway Plan, See attached.

In doing so when the BCWRD submitted its Letter of Map Revision, which effectively created the current DFIRM mapping, the floodway was based on a consensus approach.

While FEMA typically uses an allowable encroachment of a potential BFE increase of up to one foot the BCWRD requested and FEMA agreed to map based on Effective Conveyance.

Effective conveyance allows little or no changes to the BFE and therefore limits floodway encroachment to effectively backwater areas.

There is a notable difference in the floodway location in some areas and in others it does not change much.

The consensus Effective Conveyance approach was based on the Greenway Vision, and would limit development within the natural watercourse and floodplain.

There many significant community values associated with this approach from instream storage, environmental, preservation of natural areas, water quality, limiting encroachment in steep slope areas, etc...

The Greenway Vision in turn utilizes these areas for a greater community value.

As the Effective Conveyance approach is not FEMA polity the NDSWC has request a formal recommendation from the Community (City, County, BCWRD) regarding the use of approach in the new mapping.

Based on our understanding the following is required.

- > BCWRD would prepare a summary memorandum regarding the HC Greenway history and purpose for the "Effective Conveyance" approach.
- > This memorandum would then be shared with the City and County for information purposes.
- > The BCWRD would then prepared and adopt a resolution requesting the Hay Creek Floodway be based on "Effective Conveyance"
- > The City would need to pass as similar resolution for those areas within the City's floodplain jurisdiction Presume this would be a staff recommendation to the City Commission.

> The County would need to pass as similar resolution for those areas within the County's floodplain jurisdiction – Presume this would be a staff recommendation to the County Commission.

Honestly have not put pen to paper to estimate what this effort might cost, as there are any number of variables in the discussions that might arise.

The Greenway area is shown on the attached, however the City/County may wish to apply this approach to other areas, which should be discussed as part of this process.

I am including Randy Bina in this email, as while a resolution from the BPRD might not be required it would add support to the request as they were part of the original greenway plan.

Also on this email are Gabe Schell, Marcus Hall and Ray Ziegler, who attended the meeting and would be involved in the proposed process.

On a related note HEI is under contract with the NDSWC regarding the revised mapping, therefor any internal working documents for the SWC cannot be shared without their authorization.

Thanks, Apologies for the long email, but it seemed the best use of time to outline the issue prior to the discussion.

AUTHORITY: This application is being evaluated under Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 for structures or work in or affecting navigable waters of the United States and/or Section 404 of the Clean Water Act for the discharge of dredged or fill material in waters of the United States.

LOCATION: The project site is located in the Fox Island Subdivision, Lot 13, Block 1, 3333 Gallatin Drive, in the S½ of Section 19, Township 138 North, Range 80 West, Latitude 46.764639° North, Longitude -100.826617° West, Bismarck, Burleigh County, North Dakota.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: On March 16, 1994 an individual permit was issued to Keith Larson for fill associated with the development of the Fox Island Subdivisions. The permit allowed Mr. Larson to place fill in wetlands for four road crossings (0.92 acre); thirteen house pads (3.58 acres); and fourteen driveways (1.29 acres) for a total maximum impact of 5.79 acres of wetland fill. Mitigation was provided on-site by creating four wetland areas in and adjacent the Missouri River backwater channel on the south side of the development, three ponds within the development and three impoundments offsite on Square Butte Creek in Morton County. All permitted fills, except at two lots, and the mitigation were completed prior to expiration of the permit on March 31, 1997. On November 20, 2008 the project was reauthorized, giving Mr. Larson an additional three years to complete work on the two lots. The permit expired on November 20, 2011. Any fills not specifically identified in the permit require separate authorization from the Corps

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Hallmark Homes is requesting authorization to fill 0.056-acre of wetland to construct a home, garage and septic system on Lot 13 of Block 1 in the Fox Island

Subdivision. Current estimates indicate that 450 cubic yards of subsoil fill, 35 cubic yards of topsoil and 22 cubic yards of concrete would be used to raise the lot to the desired buildable elevations. In addition, an irrigation system would be installed for lawn watering. Exact design of the intake system was not provided; however, Hallmark Homes is committed to installing a system that complies with the 2017 Nationwide Permit Regional Conditions for intake systems. Based on the available information, the overall project purpose is construction of a single family residence at an elevation high enough to reduce the flood potential and allow the septic system drain field to work. The attached drawings provide location information, aquatic resources delineated on the lot and preferred layout of the home, garage and septic system.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Environmental Setting. The lot is located between Gallatin Drive and the Missouri River backwater channel, midway between the Missouri River and Tavis Road. The south part of the lot was excavated to create wetlands in and adjacent the Missouri River backwater channel as mitigation for the original permit. High water levels in the Missouri River directly influence levels in the backwater channel. When the aquatic resource delineation was completed in early September, approximately 1.46 acres of the platted 2.369 acres were not inundated by the levels in the backwater channel. Approximately 0.153-acre of wetland was delineated adjacent the backwater channel and an additional 0.056-acre wetland was delineated farther north. The southern half of the lot, with the exception of the Missouri River backwater channel and adjacent wetland, is forested. The north ½ of the lot appears to have less trees on GoogleEarth imagery, but may have been cleared, naturally has less trees or experienced a die-off following the 2011 flood. No work has been done in wetlands; however, trees east of the wetland proposed to be filled have been cleared. An additional 5 trees would be removed if the wetland is allowed to be filled.

Alternatives. As stated in the beginning of this public notice, the applicant has indicated the location and configuration of the home, garage and septic system was selected to minimize impacts to trees on the lot. Additional information concerning project alternatives may be available from the applicant or their agent. Other alternatives may develop during the review process for this permit application. All reasonable project alternatives, in particular those which may be less damaging to the aquatic environment, will be considered.

Mitigation. The Corps requires that applicants consider and use all reasonable and practical measures to avoid and minimize impacts to aquatic resources. If the applicant is unable to avoid or minimize all impacts, the Corps may require compensatory mitigation. The applicant has proposed to offset loss of wetlands by purchasing mitigation credits from Ducks Unlimited In-Lieu Fee Program at a 2:1 ratio (mitigation: impact).

OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AUTHORIZATIONS: Water quality certification or a waiver, as required under Section 401 of the Clean Water Act from the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality, Water Quality Division (DEQ), is required for this project. The Corps will submit a request for consideration to DEQ on the applicant's behalf.

HISTORIC PROPERTIES: In 1992 the entire parcel slated for development was reviewed and the North Dakota State Historic Preservation Officer (ND SHPO) concurred with the Corps "No

Historic Properties" determination [ND SHPO Reference No. 92-488]. The work proposed would occur in the previous APE; however, to ensure the Omaha District is in compliance with the NHPA and amendments and the procedures set forth in 33 CFR, Appendix C, we will evaluate input by Indian Tribes, the ND SHPO, and any interested parties in response to this public notice and will consult, as appropriate.

ENDANGERED SPECIES: This project is located within the known ranges of the endangered Interior least tern (*Sterna antillarum*), Pallid Sturgeon (*Scaphirhynchus albus*), Whooping crane (*Grus americana*) and Gray Wolf (*Canus lupus*); the threatened Piping plover (*Charadrius melodus*), Rufa red knot (*Calidris cantus rufa*) and Northern long-eared bat [NLEB] (*Myotis septentronalis*); and critical habitat for the Piping plover has been identified in and adjacent the Missouri River. In compliance with the Endangered Species Act, the Corps has determined that the project would have "no effect" on threatened or endangered species or designated critical habitat. Using the 4d Rule, potential for impacts to NLEB are eliminated through incorporation of timing restrictions for tree removal. The Corps will initiate consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, pursuant to Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act, if new information arises, as appropriate.

The above determinations are based on information provided by the applicant and our preliminary review.

EVALUATION FACTORS: The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impacts, including cumulative impacts, of the described activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefit, which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the described activity, must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the described activity will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, consideration of property ownership and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people. The activity's impact on the public interest will include application of the Section 404(b)(1) guidelines promulgated by the Administrator, Environmental Protection Agency (40 CFR Part 230).

The Corps is soliciting comments from the public, Federal, State, and local agencies and officials, Indian tribes, and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps to determine whether to issue, modify, condition, or deny a permit for this proposal. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.






